Table Numbers


I plan to shift the focus of information gathering from the types of session that clubs are offering to other data. One concern is that many experiencing low table numbers.

This update, with data from more clubs, shows bigger fields at dedicated premises.



The **u3a** (University of the Third Age) is a charity enhancing the lives of retired and semi-retired people by creating networks of local groups who form groups to learn from each other, practice crafts, sports and mind sports at minimal cost.



There over 1,000 u3a's across the country, most towns have at least one. Local groups typically provide around a dozen activities.

Bridge is well established in the **u3a** network. Some groups focus on. learning and informal card play, possibly rubber or chicago grou manage considerable duplicate fields. There are 27 **u3a** group web sites in England on Bridgewebs and a couple of EBU affiliated clubs.

For example:

The <u>Rugby</u> **u3a** group offers four different bridge sessions a week, in different locations and offering different levels of play. In <u>Kenilworth</u> a group meets weekly and plays duplicate in a church hall with ten or twelve tables.

Steve Carter is the u3a national Bridge Subject Adviser and has long taught and promoted online bridge in the **u3a** network, particularly fc Bridge Club Live. He has created a **u3a** web site on Bridgewebs.

Steve looked to start a major low-cost online beginners learning programme online and hoped to use the Smartbridge resources that EBI provide. This has so far not been successful.

There is a u3a annual Spring Charity Bridge Festival, open to both Face-to-face and online Clubs, starting w/c 22^{nd} May 2023 which is target £1,000 each for Alzheimer's Research UK and Age UK.

There must be potential gain for both worlds here. **u3a** groups could benefit from duplicate bridge club teaching, organising skills, resources, and even venues.

Many **u3a** players will never be interested in playing duplicate. However, others might enjoy it and find their way into club duplicate sessior contact with clubs.

Sharing the Income - a small backward? step

It has become clear that the EBU's need for income to sustain its current operations overrides all other considerations and there is no room for continuous continuou

In the year 2023-2024 the EBU UM rises by 2p to 44p. Most clubs will also pay an additional county amount bringing the fee per seat to 46r.

It emerges now that clubs whose offerings are wholly online can affiliate direct to the EBU. These clubs will not have to pay a county UM. So ra assist clubs in the financial struggle to provide face to face bridge, the EBU has created a small financial advantage for online only organis

Equally clubs really need to consider raising their table money. This would still be the best value organised leisure activity!
