





# How are clubs doing?

Data gathering is going well. Most weeks two or three clubs are added to the database. Amongst the over 700 clubs in the database there are about 1500 weekly duplicate sessions. The "Session" database now contains details of 267 sessions, and so is a reasonably sized sample. The session records the tables numbers (average of latest three weeks at review data) by day of week and time of day. Here are a couple of key graphics.





There's more information here, typically updated once a fortnight.

## Fairness, Friendliness and Cheating

Most face to face clubs offer one session of bridge, usually face to face, in a shared community space for a field of seven tables. The chance that such a club is EBU affiliated is roughly 50%/50%.

Most players will be there for social purposes, a few will be interested in EBU Master Points or National Grade, but most won't. Very few will be interested in county or national events. If they play outside the club it will probably be on a bridge holiday of some kind.

Players want to play a fair game in a friendly atmosphere. They will probably expect a low level of "social" cheating i.e. face pulling, body language. They will expect to be protected from rudeness/bullying and from systematic cheating.

# Laws and Regulations

The International Laws of Duplicate Bridge can be downloaded free of charge. They can be bought in hard copy from the English Bridge Union, the Welsh Bridge Union and probably others. The EBU is not contributing to the revision of the laws due in 2027. These laws are the definition of the game.

International competitions are subject to the regulations of, for example, the World Bridge Federation, or the European Bridge authority.

The English Bridge Union maintains and publishes a substantial library of comment, interpretation of the laws, together with "local" i.e. English regulation. There is the White Book, the Blue Book and Appeal proceedings. These are most important and are applied to competitions run directly by the EBU.

Clubs use of this EBU body of work is at the discretion of the clubs. The distribution of material important to clubs is scattered amongst the laws etc. For example the book rulings on bid out of turn, and use of bidding boxes, or use of the Stop card. Convention cards are important to the regulation of National and International tournaments, but how often are they seen in clubs?

The "Yellow" book contains the a really useful selection of material particularly applicable to clubs. It's not published by the EBU.

# Laws, Regulations, Fairness & Friendliness in Clubs

The attitude to the laws and their enforcement varies.

Some clubs, and players are apprehensive that strict enforcement of the laws and/or regulations is at odds with the enjoyment of the game. The EBU General Manager recently stated (paraphrased): "Failure to enforce the laws and regulations create unfairness, which is itself unfriendly".

Here are quotes from club web sites and an extract of correspondence I had with one of my members lately:

#### 1 From an unaffiliated club web site

We are a friendly group which meet every Wednesday evening at 7pm in the Martlesham Heath Pavilion. Whilst we are not affiliated to the EBU – English Bridge Union, we do follow their rules which sets the structure for playing the game but then allows us discretion to vary the speed of play and cater for all bridge players – whether beginners, improvers or advanced regulars.

#### 2 From another unaffiliated club web site

Our ethos is to provide a welcoming Bridge experience that supports pairs new to duplicate bridge as well as more experienced players.

We do not bind ourselves strictly to English Bridge Union laws, however, 'calling for the Director' is still fine where there is a genuine dilemma, and the Director's ruling is final.

Players are treated with tolerance and respect and new players are always very welcome. Above all, we remember bridge is only a game of cards and whilst we all do our best to win:

"Bridge is for Fun"

"Enjoy bridge - it's only a game!"

#### 3 Recent Correspondence

Is there a time limit when replying to a bid from your partner? I couple weeks ago an opponent told us there was however all four of us didn't know what this is? I can't find any information on this? Xx

No, there is no time limit.

If you think for a long time, argumentative opponents may feel that the pause has informed your partner that you had a difficult/marginal choice. If your partner then bids, opponents may ask the director to check that the bid would have been the same without the pause. If the director judges that it would, then everything is left as it is. If the director feels that your partner's bid was influenced by the pause AND that it made a difference to the result, then the score may be changed

to a more expected result.

The lesson is first: always try to bid at a regular, perhaps slightly slower, pace than you need to.

Secondly, if your partner has paused, be sure that your bid is not influenced by the pause, as it may hint at unauthorised information.

Thirdly, ALWAYS call the director if anyone at the table makes any comment about laws or regulations. This is expressly forbidden at our club (was it at our club?). One reason is that players are frankly more often wrong than right, another is that this is intimidating behaviour, and finally we would want to stamp on it.

### **Tournament Director!**

The TD has to carry out the duties of Master of Ceremonies, problem solver and referee.

As MC, there is the tone to be set. The TD needs to establish authority, but also accessibility and must get players to relax and intent on their own enjoyment and that of others. The movement must be selected. Players must understand their part in it, and moves must be called. At the end something must be done with the results.

As problem solver there will be an unpredictable mix of everything from lost cards, to wrongly entered scores, misinformation claims, slow play and outbreaks of bad manners or worse.

As referee the critical balance of ensuring fair play with maintaining an atmosphere appropriate to the event.

There must be around a thousand people doing this weekly.

The majority will be volunteers, some will be untrained, or trained many years ago.

The attitude to and support for the director will vary from club to club.

I would love to know your stories, problems and suggestions to ensure we look after, train, and make life as easy as possible for our TDs.
