This has been a busy month with action needed because of the new Data Protection laws, another rent rise and, together with our income being affected by the cancellations due to snow, this means we will probably make a loss this year - though this will be absorbed by our reserves as promised at the last AGM. At our committee meeting in April we decided to join the anti-plastic revolution and not to provide single-use cups any more - more on this point later. The club is overall holding its own with attendances, though the 8% increase this quarter compared with last year's, was solely due to the Friday session, often with more tables than our evening sessions where I think the attendance would have dropped were it not for the hosting system bringing in members who would not be able to attend otherwise. I hope you will continue to consider supporting the club with this - 64% of sessions in the last quarter had a host available - so we can face any future rent rises more confidently.

Still early days yet but all ladders are well under way and more updates on these later in the year.

SINGLE USE CUPS

You may be surprised to know that we use 6,000 polystyrene cups a year - at a cost of more than £150 - and it is reckoned that this material takes between 500 years-to-forever-never (no-one really knows) to biodegrade. The same day we discussed this at our committee meeting, Waitrose announced that they are not providing single use cups any more - and they reckon that they alone used 52million cups a year which adds up to 221 tonnes of plastic and 665 tonnes of paper. We have researched other "disposable" cups and find it is difficult to find any at a reasonable cost that do not contain a plastic liner, and even if we did use those instead of polystyrene they would need special disposal at a collection point rather than in a normal bin which goes into landfill. So, we have taken the decision not to provide single use cups any more when the present stocks run out, probably sometime this month. We will continue to provide tea/coffee/soft drinks/biscuits, etc, as usual but you will need to bring your own mug. I hope you agree with this decision which we feel is a step we can take towards reducing plastic waste. If anyone has a better idea, we would be pleased to consider it.
