Competition Secretary's Report January 2018

Dyer Smith Cup

We had 17.5 tables for the Dyer Smith. This was a major improvement on last year's 12 tables which, for some unknown reason, was particularly low. We are not back to the dizzy heights of the 23 tables achieved in the 2014-15 season but at least we are back to the average for this event.

Fleming Femina / Hunter Homines

Entries currently stand at 9.5 tables for the Fleming Femina and 13.5 tables for the Hunter Homines. This time last year we had 12 and 13 tables respectively. Last year we reached 13 and 14.5 tables. The closing date for entries is Monday 8th January but of course we will accept entries up to the end of the week.

Arnold Cup

We have 17 teams in this year's competition. This is three down on last year which was six down on 2015-16. Previously numbers had been slowly increasing. The average over the last 12 years is just under 20 teams per season. I believe some teams have dropped out as they were always drawn against the same one or two teams. However due to ensuring first round matches are relatively local this is impossible to change due to the limited number of teams entering.

Seven teams lost their first match in the Cup and have been put forward into the Plate.

We now use the EBU's website to make the draws for the Cup and Plate and to display the results. There is a link from the Cup and Plate pages under the *Competitions* tab on the KCBA web site.

Corbett League

We have had repeat entries from all the clubs that participated last year with the exception of Otford in the Mitchell Salver. There are no new teams entered this year but the event is still well supported


Area Leagues
