"I first took up the game in college, wasting my Dad's money playing rubber bridge for a tenth-of-a-cent a point till 2:00 a.m. instead of studying. I toyed with duplicate, playing team-of-4 IMPs in adjacent dorm rooms. After college came the Peace Corps: 2 1/2 years in the jungles of Borneo. That'll grow you up.

"I came back to Little Rock, serious about education, and played a little Bridge at the Durwood location...met Bill and Peggy Jett, Curtis Finch, Allan and David Siebert, in the early 70's. Marriage and med school ended that, though, and building a medical practice was all-consuming. (Continued on Page 2)

"I grew up watching my parents at the Bridge table, and I played dorm bridge while in college. The next 25 years were spent moving around the country, raising children and working. In 1992, I was back in Little Rock working for a local advertising agency, and my boss and I decided we would give duplicate Bridge a try. We took lessons from Dee Eanes at LRDBC on Durwood and were indoctrinated to duplicate by the likes of Al Childs, Rick and Elaine Lowens, the Sieberts, and yes, David Cockcroft and Matt Williams.

"Two years later I moved to Morrilton, then Russellville to manage a group of radio stations in the River Valley area, and for the next 9 years once again concentrated on working instead of bridge. In July of 2003, I retired and wasted little time in moving back to Little Rock. On a warm summer night in August I went to play duplicate on novice night. Another new player,

"Almost 40 years later, looking retirement in the face, it was time to rekindle the passion. I looked up the club's address on Google 4 years ago, walked in cold, and asked if I could join. Classy lady Betsy put up with me while I learned how little I knew, and how much duplicate had changed since the smoke-hazed rooms and paper results slips of the early 70's.

"I hope everyone at our club realizes how good we've got it. This a fabulous club, with all the elements for long-term success: a zealous education program, comfortable novice games, hard-working non-complaining members doing things like dealing boards, sprucing up the building, organizing and managing tournaments, etc. And maybe best of all, very little of the unpleasant, even rude, behavior at the tables so common in the 60's and 70's. I look forward to lots of good times with good people."

Romance and duplicate Bridge – it doesn't get any better than that! Fourteen years later the LRDBC is like a family to both of us.

## LIFE MASTER REQUIREMENT *UPDATE*



Any member who originally joined the ACBL prior to January 1, 2010, and whose membership has lapsed, may have the Life Master rank requirements existing for members who joined prior to January 2, 2010 applied to them if:

- Their membership is reinstated prior to July 1, 2018, or
- b. If reinstated on or after July 1, 2018, upon payment of a one-time fee of \$50.00 to the ACRI

Anyone who is a new Life Master as a result of this change may continue to play in non-Life Master events and tournaments until July 2, 2018.

Because our **Directors** love running a smooth and fair game, many hours are spent studying new Laws.



Show your appreciation to the Directors by arriving 15 minutes before game time, and being cooperative and courteous at all times.



Janice Atterberry - Life Master

"As a child I played lots of card games. My first exposure to Bridge was kibitzing in college, and before long I was in the Student Center playing Bridge whenever I did not have a class scheduled. After college the game was always a big part of my social life – Bridge luncheons during the day and dinner Bridge on weekends. Travis and I taught our neighbors, Jim and Luraette Tucker, how to play and since we had children around the same ages it was easy to get a Bridge game going without even needing a babysitter. We also enjoyed joint family "Bridge" vacations with the Tuckers, some of which were very expensive due to the guys' fondness for wagering.

"My Bridge groups eventually switched to duplicate, and in 1979 I began playing at Durwood. Travis and I switched partners and played Swiss games with Don and Marsha Boss. Sometime in the eighties, my life went a different direction and I did not play any kind of cards for about 30 years.

"A couple of years ago, Travis and Jim decided to start playing, this time with Jim being the teacher, and I was recruited to play with Luraette so they could practice. I had never seen a bidding box, nor an electronic scorekeeper, and the new conventions were Greek to me . . . but it all began again!"

The old adage, "What goes around comes around" is true in many areas. It has been said that Janice and I taught Jim and Luraette Tucker how to play Bridge, but that's not true. What we did was introduce them to bridge with the basics, but David Siebert taught them how to play. There is a huge difference between introducing and teaching. But, we did enjoy several years of playing with Jim and Luraette while Janice and I were also playing on Durwood and going to tournaments.

What does that old adage have to do with anything? The "goes around" part is when we introduced them to bridge. Well, Janice and I got so busy with our three daughters that we stopped playing while the Tuckers got serious and have earned the rank of Silver Life Master. The "comes around" part is that some 25+ years later they invited us over to play Bridge. That was it. The fire was rekindled!

We soon learned that the game had changed tremendously, and it was like starting all over. Not only that, we now had to have 500 points with 50 of them gold to become a Life Master. Having 90 points with 2 gold, I said several times that I wouldn't live long enough to become a Life Master. However, after playing for a little over two years, I started 2018 needing 95 points with 6 gold. Based on the production of the past two years, I decided that I just might live long enough to make it. Then, of all things, the ACBL had a rule change. Anyone that had been a member before 2010 but had not continued to pay dues would be grandfathered in as a Life Master (see article on Page 2). Janice and I qualified and became Life Masters with the "stroke" of an email. It was rather anticlimactic. I was anticipating winning the final points in the heat of battle with much exhilaration. However, I don't protect, but graciously accepted.



The February meeting of the LRDBC Board was called to order on February 10, 2018, by President Fran Cockcroft. Present at the meeting were Secretary Cheryl Floyd, Treasurer Rick Lowens, and Board members Bitsy Cates, Leslie Hollingsworth, John Mueller, Dick Heil, Roger Amick, Renee Shackleford and Kaye Stanley. Also in attendance were ex-officio members Lead Director Dick Chapman, Past President Byron Southern, along with representative of The Bridge House Art Pfeifer and Newsletter Editor Becky Bien.

The minutes from the January meeting were approved by a voice vote.

Fran Cockcroft reported that there should no longer be a space issue with classes and dealing teams as game directors will be dealing their own boards. She also reported that there was a great turnout for the REACH (Regional Event at Club House) games.

Rick Lowens reported that our table count for 2017 was down from the 2016 total, the lowest table count since 2013. We have a total of 380 members for 2018. We have \$1804 for distribution to our charities and Dick Heil made a motion to round this amount up to \$2000 which was seconded by Bitsy Cates and passed by a voice vote. The honorees will be invited to the Club on "Pi Day +1" on March 15<sup>th</sup>.

Dick Heil reported that the Game Development Committee recommended that the Tuesday night game fee be returned to \$5.00 starting on the first Tuesday in March. Dick Heil moved, seconded by Bitsy Cates that the GDC's recommendation be approved. It was approved by voice vote. The GDC will conduct a survey concerning night games starting times, number of boards played, etc.

Kaye Stanley reported we had a great 499er tournament in January and grossed \$2,640.80.

Bitsy Cates thanked the Club for allowing her Meet and Greet group to play at our club on the last Thursday in February. They are tentatively scheduled to play on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursdays beginning in March if its members are agreeable to the terms proposed by the LRDBC. They

have a lot of beginning Bridge players who will get a chance to see our club.

Dick Chapman reported that the 2017 ACBL Laws are fairer (but not simpler) and our Directors are studying them. Directors will also be learning how to use BBO robots for 3+ board sitouts. He stated that if a Director determines a violation of the club's zero tolerance policy has occurred, there is no discretion on the penalty (the penalty is automatically asserted). Dick emphasized that club members are not to make their own rulings at the table.

Art Pfeifer reported that it was the last LRDBC Board meeting that he would attend as the liaison for The Bridge House.

As there was no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.
