Oxfordshire players in the England Women's International Trials

Top of the results table in the 'Lady Milne' trials last weekend was Abbey Smith, who teaches bridge and runs the ever-busier club at Drayton Parslow, playing with Heather Dhondy. Several other Oxfordshire players also took part: Ewa Wieczorek, Emily Middleton, Diana Nettleton and Siyu Ren (playing with Laura Covill, who only recently moved away from the county). Abbey will be representing England in the home internationals in March.

Results

The qualifying round for the County Pairs championship was won by **Dinah and Andrew Lintott**. The final will be on 11th March.

This month all three of the <u>County teams</u> won their matches against Worcestershire. The County now heads both the second- and third-division league tables.

Events

Abingdon Bridge Club is staging a blue-pointed Swiss Pairs on Sunday 4th February.

The <u>Harwell Cup</u> event (for teams of 4) will be held on Sunday 11th February 2018 at Roke (Wallingford). Blue points are awarded.

The next County Seniors Pairs is on Monday, 12th February at Roke (near Wallingford).

A <u>Junior Bridge and Minibridge Competition</u> for 8 to 18 y.o. players is being held at Wallingford BC on Sunday 25th February.

The County is holding a <u>fundraiser for the national junior bridge squad</u>. The juniors (Oxfordshire players among them) have been doing very well in international competition, including winning places at the World Youth Team Championships in China this summer. It all takes money. The fundraising event will take place at Abingdon BC on Monday 12th March. "The emphasis of the day is on learning and fun," with a tea. Cost £20. It currently looks as though all the expenses will be covered by sponsorship, in which case your entire £20 will be going to support the teams.

Oxford BC has an active programme of seminars, including one by Michael Byrne (international player and writer in the EBU magazine) on 17th March. Check out the OBC website for full details of the programme.
