### COME JOIN THE 2018 WBL UNIT KNOCKOUT!

The deadline for entering the 2018 Washington Bridge League Unit KO is JANUARY 18.

There will be three flights of play: Flight A, Flight B, plus a Flight C for Non-Life Master players with fewer than 500 masterpoints. The masterpoint cutoff for Flight B and Flight C will be determined by the coordinator after reviewing the entries and the masterpoints of the teams entered. A 0-100 flight may be instituted if entries warrant.

For Flight C, the seeding will be random draw. For Flights A and B, the GNT qualifier on *January 11* will be used as a factor in seeding; however, you don't have to play in the GNT qualifier in order to play in the Unit KOs. If you have six members of your KO team, they can play on six different GNT teams on January 11. They will have six different seed numbers.

The cost is only \$30/team for the whole event. The winning team in each flight of the 2016 Unit KO will be awarded a cash award equal to their entry fee.

You can also see and answer the problems at the WBL website. WBL Solvers Club uses Washington Standard as published July 1996. I accept only the first answer from each solver unless it is clear that the solver wants to correct his answer.

I personally score all the problems. If a majority of the solvers vote for an answer, and the answer is reasonable I will give that answer 100 points. I will not give 100 points to an answer that I consider bad no matter how many experts vote for it. There are times when I want to make a point. I will give that answer 100 points and will therefore give the majority answer 90 points. For the other answers I consider how good the answer is and how many experts vote for it for its score. If you submitted an answer that got 20 points, that bid would get a bad score at the table. A good exercise would be to fig-

ure out why I gave your answer 20 points. You might have misread the problem.

The book Washington Standard second edition is out. If you are a serious bridge player, this book is a must. You can purchase a copy from Steve for \$25.00 whenever you see him or can send him a check for \$30.60 which includes \$5.60 for priority mail.

This could be a partscore hand if the overcaller has  $\bigstar xxx \, \forall AQJxx \, \bigstar KQxx \, \bigstar x$  since you have five top losers. This could be a slam hand if overcaller has  $\bigstar x \, \forall AKQxxx \, \bigstar Axx \, \bigstar xxx$ . Both of these scenarios are possible. There are plenty of hands where game is on, for instance  $\bigstar xx \, \forall AKQJxx \, \bigstar xxx$ . Since the opponents are non-vulnerable, I expect further bidding from them.

Six experts force to game. Two experts make a bid which has an obvious meaning. They jump to 4 ♦ which shows heart support, short diamonds and game-forcing values. If partner has long diamonds, good hearts and short spades, he'll make a positive bid. However, splinters show four-card support. Overcaller might mis-evaluate his possible AQ765 of hearts.

**Parker:** "4♦—Lots of options, 3♥, 4♥, 3♣, 4♣. If partner has only ♥AKQxxx and ♠A we make a slam. I will make the most forward-going bid."

**Hopkins:** "4 ◆ —I would like to be able to make a fit-showing jump, but that's not what anybody is playing. This will at least get in my support, Diamond shortness, and game-going values. I might miss a slam when partner has something like ♠ Ax ♥ AKOxxx ♦ Jxx ♣ xx and doesn't make a trv."

If I held  $\triangle Ax \bigvee AKQxxx \blacklozenge Jxx \spadesuit xx$  and partner splintered in diamonds, I would bid Blackwood.

One expert jumps to game in partner's suit. Partner is unlikely to move over  $4 \, \forall$  and will not know about your solid club suit. She will not be able to help if the opponents bid  $4 \, \spadesuit$  or  $5 \, \spadesuit$ .

**Shi:** "4♥—Not really thinking slam here."

Three experts make a bid which could have two possible meanings. I admit that I would not know which. While  $4 \, \text{\ref could}$  be fit-showing, some play unusual jumps in this situation as a splinter. Since  $3 \, \text{\ref site}$  is forcing,  $4 \, \text{\ref must}$  show heart support but is it shortness or length?

**Sontag:** "4.—Fit showing. Not ideal as I would like to have four hearts."

Usually fit-showing jumps show four-card support and five of the bid suit. You could have more cards in either suit. Players who play fit-showing jumps often abuse the convention as in this hand where they only have three-card support. Assuming partner takes 4 & as fit-showing, he might go wrong later thinking that you have four-card heart support and he might lead a heart from the KJ instead of a club from nothing against a diamond contract.

**Korbel:** "4♣—This should be read as a fit jump, which will put us in a better position if the opponents compete to 4♠ or 5♠. If they don't, it doesn't matter much what I bid."

**Woolsey:** "4♣—I assume this is fit-showing — it should be. I may need partner's input vs. 4♠."

Fit-showing! Where are your four hearts?

Two experts cue bid. If partner makes a return cue bid of  $3 \spadesuit$ , slam is likely.

**Theurer:** "3 ◆ —Especially at matchpoints, this hand belongs in hearts, and slam is not impossible. E/W are at favorable and one or both opponents could be bidding on air. I will cue bid cheaply and see if partner can cue bid a spade control. The interesting part could come later if the opponents

compete in diamonds or spades. 4. would be possible if it was fit-showing but many play it would be a splinter, or that if fit-showing the suits would be less skewed than my hand is here."

**Feldman:** "3 ◆ —My cue bid shows limit raise or better values. With diamond and spade stoppers partner may bid 3NT. With only spade stoppers, he could clarify his stoppers situation by bidding 3 ♠ and we will play in  $4 \blacktriangledown$ . If he rebids  $3 \blacktriangledown$  I will pass since we could easily have four losers."

Three experts join me and bid their six-card solid suit.  $3 \clubsuit$  is forcing. We bid what is in front of us.

If we end up defending against a high-level diamond contract, we will get a club lead.

**Adams:** "3♣—I can live with 4♦-splinter, but if we end up defending diamonds, I will want to have bid my clubs."

**Schwartz:** "3♣—A likely high level decision is coming and I need to get clubs into the picture to help us make it. 3♣ is unlikely to be passed out."

**King:** "3♣—This is clearly forcing and shows where I live, although it violates the support with support dictum."

Fit showing jumps show four-card support for partner's suit and at least five in the bid suit.

Double, 1NT and pass got votes from experts. I'm surprised that  $1 \triangleq didn$ 't get any expert votes. There are problems with each call. If you double, what are you going to do if partner responds  $1 \triangleq ?$  If you overcall 1NT, there are two problems. One is that partner might put you in  $3 \triangleq .$  The other problem is that you might find partner with a six-count and a four-card

major and you'll play 1NT instead of your 4-4 major-suit fit. If you pass, you won't have a bid if responder responds one-of-either major.

Five experts overcall 1NT. They will miss their major-suit fit if partner has a four-card major and fewer than eight HCP.

**Parker:** "1NT—Partner can bid Stayman and we will find any 4-4 major fit. I have no good bid if I double and partner bids diamonds."

**Korbel:** "1NT—I don't want to get shut out of the auction. This will get us to either major suit game if we have the values."

What if partner has  $\bigstar xxx \forall Kxxx \bigstar xxxx \bigstar Kx$ ? You'll play in 1NT, possibly down, when you have play for  $4 \forall$ .

**Adams:** "1NT—Vulnerability wrong to trap. Not my style to double with side singleton."

**Schwartz:** "1NT—No good options as I am a king light for double followed by notrump and bidding a major risks missing game in the other. At least I am near a minimum for the HCP for 1NT."

**King:** "1NT—This lies by one diamond. Double lies by two, although partner will strain to bid a four-card major if he has one."

Five experts join me and double. If partner responds  $1 \spadesuit$ , you have three possible continuations  $1 \spadesuit$ ,  $1 \spadesuit$  or 1NT, none of which are that bad. Good partners respond a major.

**Sontag:** "Double—Like this much more than 1NT which I abhor."

**Woolsey:** "Double—Partner is allowed to have a major. If he bids diamonds, I can rebid notrump."

**Theurer:** "Double—Tough problem; 1NT would communicate HCP and club stopper, but we could easily belong in a 4-4 major suit fit which could be missed if partner isn't strong enough to invite over 1NT. So I will do the modern thing and make an off-shape takeout double, hoping partner doesn't specifically bid 1 ◆. If he jumps to 2 ◆ I can bid 3NT."

**Feldman:** "Double—If partner bids a major, I will raise to show my values. If partner bids 1 ♦, I will be comfortable correcting to 1NT. If he bids 2 ♦, I will bid 3NT."

Hopkins: "Double—If we have a major-suit fit, I am golden as my hand has increased in value. We may even get to a making game that anyone who overcalls 1NT might not when responder just doesn't have quite enough to act. If partner bids 1♦, I will equal-level-conversion with a 1♥-bid for which I should have at least one more Heart and hope to scramble from there,"

One expert passes. Only if responder responds  $1 \spadesuit$  will she be able to get back in the auction. If it goes  $1 \clubsuit - 1 \heartsuit - 1$ NT, double is a takeout double of hearts.

**Shi:** "Pass—Pass and double back in later will often show this hand type. I'm too strong to distort my hand with a one-of-a-major overcall and not strong enough to double then rebid notrump."

When you're 4-4 in the majors, a takeout double is more likely to get you to the right strain.

If you rebid your heart suit, you are committed to play in hearts. That would work out reasonable if partner has at least two hearts. But what if partner has fewer than two hearts? This suit will not play well opposite one heart and will play very poorly opposite a void.

Three experts make a conservative  $2 \checkmark call$ .

**Parker:** "2♥—Not worth 3♥ or 2NT with such poor heart spots. I will go low and hope for a plus score."

**Hopkins:** "2 ♥—A lot will depend upon partner's fit with my suit so this is the best way to let him know my primary feature. I'm sure partner knows to raise to 3 ♥ with a doubleton and some useful looking cards, especially as we are red."

**King:** "2♥—Occasionally it's good to have some extras. I won't jump with such a suit and 2♣ is too much an operation for me."

Three experts jump to  $3 \, \text{V}$ . When there is a choice, I like my  $3 \, \text{V}$ -jumps to play reasonable opposite shortness. I would need at least the  $\, \text{V}10 \, \text{extra}$  to jump in hearts.

**Woolsey:** " $3 \bigvee$ —Hearts is our most likely game, and I'm too strong to bid just  $2 \bigvee$ ."

Shi: "3 ♥—This seems like a textbook 3 ♥ bid to me. My trumps are not weak enough for me to bid 2 ♣."

**Feldman:** "3 ♥—I wish I had the ♥ J as well, but with a five-loser hand in hearts, I will bid 3 ♥. 2NT is an overbid given my diamond shortness and 2 ♥ is a clear underbid especially at IMPs."

Five experts join me and rebid  $2 \clubsuit$ . If partner passes  $2 \clubsuit$ , he will have at most one heart. Playing in hearts, you'd have at least two heart losers and could easily have more. If partner has two hearts, he'll take a preference to  $2 \heartsuit$ . You could then raise hearts showing 14-17 HCP and six bad hearts. You will be then playing in an eight-card fit.

**Schwartz:** "2♣—Gives us most flexibility if partner bids again. If he doesn't might be the right spot.

If partner passes 2, he'd most likely be 3=1=4=5 and we'd be playing our 5-3 club fit instead of our 6-1 heart fit.

**Sontag:** "2♣—Most flexible choice."

**Korbel:** "2♣—The "classic" answer to this dilemma. I will raise 2♥ to 3♥. "

**Theurer:** " $2 \clubsuit$ —Three reasonable choices are  $2 \blacktriangledown$  which is somewhat conservative and could miss a vulnerable game.  $3 \blacktriangledown$  is okay but would like slightly better hand or heart texture. Middle-of-the-road  $2 \clubsuit$  which is less limited than  $2 \blacktriangledown$ . I will choose the latter since over  $2 \spadesuit$  I can bid  $2 \blacktriangledown$ , and over other calls such as  $2 \blacktriangledown$  or 2 NT or even  $2 \spadesuit$  which is a strong club raise I can bid  $3 \blacktriangledown$  to show constructive hand with a sixth heart not quite right for an immediate  $3 \blacktriangledown$  call."

**Adams:** "2 - In between  $2 \lor and 3 \lor$ ."

If you have a weak six-card major, consider bidding a minor instead your major.

Partner has made a negative double which shows at least four spades. He could have anywhere from six to twenty-six HCP. If he has five or more spades, he should have fewer than 11 points. If you had four spades or four diamonds, your response would be easy. However, you're 3-3 in the two suits that partner is asking you to bid and have a minimum opener. Since you have a choice between two three-card suits, your opening five-card suit and 2NT, make the bid which does not encourage partner.

Three experts have a club stopper and bid 2NT. 2NT should show a sound opener unless you have no other choice. If responder has eleven points, he might bid 3NT. 3NT will be difficult with twelve opposite eleven without a running suit.

**Parker:** "2NT—I guess everyone will say what's the problem? Do you want me to bid a three- card spade suit?"

**Theurer:** "2NT—Many choices, all of them flawed in some way - I don't like bidding a three-card suit unless other options are worse, so I will show my minimum balanced hand with club stopper for now and see what if anything happens next."

Hopkins: "2NT—A balanced minimum. If partner is very unbalanced, he can bid a six-card suit or cue bid 3♣ to make me pick with 5-5. My biggest fear is partner has a reasonably balanced 9 - 10 count and we go down two vulnerable but at least we were in the highest scoring contract and our teammates could cover us by going plus."

Two experts bid  $2 \spadesuit$ .  $2 \spadesuit$  could get partner encouraged.

Sontag bids 2 . Partner will assume that you

have four spades and could overbid looking for the vulnerable game.

Adams: "2 — Assume we are playing Flannery, and that free bids are forcing. I know we have seven spades, can't be sure we have seven diamonds or hearts."

Your partner is the Captain, so bid your hand correctly and let him decide where you're going.

Six experts join me and make a bid which will not encourage partner. This will allow partner to take us back to  $2 \, \Psi$  if he does not have diamonds. It will also slow him down which is what you want.

**Korbel:** "2 ♦ —I am choosing this between the two logical suits because at least this way partner can preference back to hearts whenever he wants to."

Woolsey: "2 ♦ —I'm not rebidding this heart suit. A 2 ♠-rebid may cause partner to bid too much believing I have four spades."

**Shi:** "2 ♦ —The closest thing to my hand and my cheapest option. Partner can go back to 2 ♥ with a doubleton if necessary."

**Schwartz:** " $2 \blacklozenge$ —Partner should be aware that three cards are high in frequency for this bid as 2NT shows extras. Need better hearts for  $2 \blacktriangledown$  as partner has at most two."

Feldman: "2 ← —IMHO this is the most flexible bid. I have a minimum hand. This way partner can pass and we will not be in trouble, or he can correct to 2 ♥ which is fine by me. If partner bids 2 ♠ I will pass since he couldn't bid 2 ♠ to begin with. If partner bids 3 ♣ I will bid 3NT to show my one club stopper."

**King:** "2 ♦—It's a toss-up between this and 2 ♥."

Two reasons to bid  $2 \spadesuit$ . When faced with a choice of bidding three-card suits, choose the minor. When faced with three poor choices, choose the cheapest.

Partner's direct unpassed-hand-2 ♣-raise in Washington Standard says that he would accept at least one game try. If he held a very weak hand such as  $\triangle Jxx \lor Qxx \diamond Jxxx & Qxx$ , he would bid 1NT-forcing first. A direct raise to 2 \( \text{shows at least a good seven points, therefore } \) we're in the game-try range. If you make a game try, what do you want partner to have which will make game percentage? Remember partner will accept at least one game try. If he holds  $\triangle xxx \nabla xxx \triangle KJxx \triangle Axx$ , he would accept a 3 ♦ game try but would not be a good dummy in  $4 \clubsuit$ . If he holds  $\spadesuit xxx \blacktriangledown xxx \spadesuit Qxx \clubsuit AQxx$ , he would accept a 3♣ game try but would not be a good dummy in  $4 \clubsuit$ . If he holds  $\spadesuit Axx \heartsuit KQx$  $\bigstar xxx \bigstar xxxx$ , he would accept a 3  $\forall$  game try and would be a great dummy in 4 . You want to make a game try but you don't want to give the opponents help with their lead. I like 2NT as a random game try. You don't want to stop the opponents from leading a heart. Over 2NT, partner will jump to 4 \( \blacktriangle \) if he would accept all game tries and no help will be given to the opponents on their opening lead. If he has  $\triangle AJx$ V10xx ◆Jxxx ♣QJx he'll sign off in 3 ♠ and again no help will be given to the opponents on their opening lead. If he has lots of his honors in one suit, he'll bid that suit. You will then sign off if he bids three-of-either-minor and will jump to game if he bids 3 ♥.

Every expert thought that the hand was too strong to pass. Nine experts bid  $3 \heartsuit$  as a game try. This could stop a heart lead which could be very helpful. If partner has 10xx of hearts, a heart lead will set up two heart tricks for you. If LHO has KQ98 of hearts, the  $3 \heartsuit$ -bid will tell him to lead a trump instead of a heart which would not be good for the offense.

**Parker:** "3 ♥—Again what's the problem. All partner needs is an ace and ♥ K for a good play for game."

Is game good if partner holds ♠xxx♥Kxx♠xxxx ♣Axx? It's certainly better with a heart lead.

**Sontag:** "3 ♥—Tough problem. If you make a natural 3 ♥-game try, responder may get overboard anytime he has four hearts but I bid it anyway. I wish I had the ♥10."

Sontag expects partner to raise any time he has four hearts. If you're making help suit game tries, wouldn't you bid  $3 \checkmark$  holding  $\bigstar KQ9753$   $\checkmark Kxx \bigstar AQJ \&x?$ 

**Korbel:** "3♥—Just a little too much to pass, even at matchpoints. This one is close in my opinion."

**Woolsey:** "3 ♥ —Game is still in the picture. The singleton king of clubs is more valuable than it appears, since it is a card partner doesn't hold, so any king he does have will be working."

**Theurer:** "3 ♥—If this were IMPs I'd probably just make a "game try" of 4 ♠... bid game and try to make it. But at matchpoints going plus is good, so making a natural/help suit game try is enough."

**Adams:** "3 ♥—Where I need help."

**King:** "3♥—This helps the opponents defend, but might get us to 4♠ when we belong there."

**Feldman:** "3♥—With a six-loser hand I will show my distribution. Partner could easily have four hearts in this sequence. After 3♥ he should know what to do."

 $3 \checkmark does not promise four hearts. Wouldn't you bid <math>3 \checkmark if$  your side suits were  $\checkmark Jxx \checkmark AKQ \checkmark x$  and you were going to make a help-suit game try?

**Hopkins:** "3 ♥ —I think the risk of going down at the three-level is far less than getting +170 when much of the field is +420. Partner's perfect hand is ♠ J10xx ♥ Kx ♦ Kxx ♣ 10xxxxx and variations thereof."

Partner's perfect hand is  $\triangle AJx \bigvee KQx \triangleright xxx$ \$10xxx. If you make a random game try, partner will jump to game with your perfect hand.

One expert makes a no-help-to-the-opponents game try. Bid game and try to make it.

**Shi:** " 4 — It might go down, but I have no reasonable way to find out from partner if game will be good. It might be hard for the opponents to defend."

One expert joins me and makes a random game try. Random game tries can get you what you need without helping the enemy.

**Schwartz:** "2NT—Random game try. Not enough to blast and don't want to give hand shape away with  $3 \, \Psi$ ."

Help-suit game tries are random as to what you have in the suit and what you need. Instead after 1Major – 2Major, start using the next step as a random game try.



So far, in putting together a basic set of conventions, we've discussed Drury, 2/1 Game Force, and the Forcing NoTrump, Next, we'll continue our look at what you should respond when partner opens One-of-a-Major (1M) and add two very common and useful conventions.

### **JACOBY TWO NO-TRUMP** FORCING RAISE AND SPLINTER BIDS OVER OPENINGS OF ONE-OF-A- MAJOR (1M)

What do you bid when partner opens 1M, and you have four-card trump support and a game-forcing hand?

There are two choices: Jacoby Two No-Trump artificial forcing raise, or a splinter bid. The latter is only used when you have shortness (a singleton or void).

### 1. Jacoby Two No-Trump

When you use the Jacoby Two No-Trump, you are in a sense becoming captain of the partnership for the moment. As well as communicating that you have a game-forcing hand with four-card trump support, you are asking partner to describe his hand further.

### Opener's rebids are as follows:

A bid at the three-level shows shortness, a singleton or void, in the suit bid. Show your singleton even if it's an honor.

- **♦**AKxxx ♥QJxx ♦Kxx **♣**x
- **♦** AKxxx ♥ KQJx ♦ AQx ♣x

These are examples of opener opening 1 \( \blacktriangle \) and rebidding 3♣ over 2NT.

A bid at the four-level shows a second five-card suit, with two of the top three honors.

- **♦** AKxxx ♥ AQxxx ◆x **♣**xx
- **♦**AKxxx ♥AKQxx **♦**xx **♣**A

These are examples of opener opening 1♠ and jumping to 4♥ over 2NT.

A bid of 3NT shows a good 13 through 15 points - a constructive minimum.

- **♦**AKxxx ♥AQ109 ♦xx ♣xx
- **♦**AKxxx ♥AKx ♦xxx **♣**xx

These are examples of opener opening 1 \( \blacktriangle \) and bidding 3NT over 2NT.

A rebid of Three-of-Opener's-Major (3M) shows 16+ points, with no singleton or void.

- ♦AKxxx ♥AJ109 ♦Ax ♣xx
- **♦**AKxxx ♥AKx ♦Kxx ♣Jx

These are examples of opener opening 1♠ and bidding  $3 \spadesuit$  over 2NT.

A jump rebid of Four-of-Opener's-Major (4M) shows a bare minimum, e.g. a hand where opener would not have bid on to game if partner had made a limit raise.

- **♦**AKxxx ♥AJx ♦xxx **♣**xx
- **♦**AKxxx ♥Axx ♦xxx **♣**xx

These are examples of opener opening 1♠ and jumping to 4♠ over 2NT.

Remember: After Opener's rebid, it's important to figure out whether or not slam may still be an option. The reason for collecting more information from opener is to decide if slam is a possibility. If Opener shows shortness, his strength is still unlimited.

### 2. Splinter Bids

A splinter bid in response to partner's opening 1M is a double-jump shift which shows a singleton or void, along with four-card trump support. Specifically, it works as follows:

Opposite a 1♠ opening bid, 4♣ shows club shortness, 4♦ shows diamond shortness and 4♥ shows heart shortness.

- **♦**Axxx ♥AJxx ♦Kxxx **♣**x
- **♦**Axxx ♥AKxx ♦KJxx **♣**x

These are examples of jumping to 4. over a 1♠ opening bid.

Opposite a 1♥ opening bid, 3♠ shows spade shortness, 4♣ shows club shortness and 4♦ shows

diamond shortness.

- **♦**x ♥AJxx ♦Kxxx ♣Axxx
- **♦**x ♥AKxx ♦KJxx **♣**Axxx

These are examples of jumping to 3♠ over a 1♥ opening bid.

You can make a splinter bid with a singleton even if the singleton in the suit is an Ace or a King.

Following a splinter bid, opener evaluates how to proceed. Of course, overall hand strength will be important in that evaluation. In addition, opener has the opportunity to judge his suit holdings opposite partner's short suit.

For example, a holding of either an Ace opposite partner's shortness, or length (four cards) opposite shortness, are good holdings. Other than the Ace, it is usually advantageous for high cards (such as a holding of KQx) to be opposite length, not shortness.

- **♦**AKxxx ♥xxxx ♦AQxx **♣**x
- **♦**AKxxx ♥Axxx ♦KQxx ♣x

These are examples of good hands after a 1 A  $-4 \heartsuit$  (short hearts, spade support and a game-forcing hand). Ask for aces and maybe kings.

On the other hand, usually shortness opposite shortness is not good. Neither is a holding that includes a Queen opposite shortness.

- **♦**AKxxx ♥xxxx ♦KQxx **♣**x
- **♦**AKxxx ♥QJx ♦xx **♣**QJx

These are examples of bad hands after a 1 ♠ -4. (short clubs, spade support and a game-forcing hand). You'd signoff in 4.
