

Responses to the question "If you have played in past seasons but do not play in the League any longer, please tell us why you stopped."


- We found the travelling too far in the evenings
- I prefer to play at a club. I did not enjoy going out on dark winter nights trying to find houses which sometimes turned out to be very uncomfortable
- Regular partner moved out of area and family issues prevented me from having the time to find a new one for teams.

 - only played many, many years ago
- Played over 10 years ago, my regular partner passed away and we were the main players of the team.so stopped when season ended.
- Personal reasons and no wish to partake in the league the subsequent survey questions serve no useful purpose



- I play bridge twice weekly. I ask if it is fair to play more frequently and leave my wife at home alone?
 - Don't know.
- one match against each team in the Division is sufficient-home or away has no relevance
- I'm personally happy with the current format, but multiple people have indicated that it has led or will lead to their withdrawal from the league. As I read it, the Master Points system favours large numbers of small divisions and a single round-robin.



- If it is best to cut the matches then a tough luck draw is best as to who plays home and who plays away. The other option is to play at one centralism venue maybe half a dozen times a season where on the day all teams play one another. This is done successfully in other parts of the Country.
- Actually I'd suggest being more radical. Have divisions of around 5 teams, play one match against each team, and play *two seasons a year*. The systems actually favour the limit case of 3 teams per division, with extremely short seasons and several "seasons" per year!



 - It's useful having a break through the summer.




- As long as it is not Ascot! Far too uncomfortable

League Rules currently require matches to be played in the evening. Would you like the flexibility to be able to play during the day instead, provided both teams agree?




