## There are only six auctions where 2/1 applies!

Definition: $2 / 1$ is ON when the OPENING bid is 1 of a suit (usually a major) and the first bid by responder with $12+$ HCP, is a new suit at the 2 level

| Opening Bid | Responder bids - 2/1 Game Forcing Responses |
| :---: | :---: |
| 1 1 | 2*, 2 - 2 - |
| $1 \vee$ | 2* 2 |
| 1 | 2* |
| 12 | None (going to the 2 level would be a "skip or jump" |

## Responder initiates 2/1 GF with these guidelines

- Must have 12+ HCP
- Can only bypass 4 card suits going up the line if the suit being bid is longer in length
- Opener bids $1 \bigcirc$. As Responder, you have 4 Spades and 5 Diamonds. Bid 2
- Opener bids 1 . As Responder, you have 4 Diamonds and $4+$ Spades, bid 1 S. (More important to tell partner about spades.)
- If Opener bids $1 \underset{\text { and }}{ }$, and Responder wants to bid Hearts, must have $5+\bigcirc$ to initiate $2 / 1$
- Opponents have not bid other than Pass


## Responder's 1st bid - examples

## What should you bid as Responder with the following hand?

Opener bids 1 . You, responder - 14 HCP
Q K 10
-AQ763

- 93
\& AJ42

Ans: $2 \bigcirc-2 / 1-$ You have 5 H

What if Opener bids 1 NT. Ans: 2 - transfer to H

## Opener's 2nd bid

- Jump to 3 of your major with $16+$ HCP \& a $6+$ card solid suit or longer (AKQJxx or AKQxxxx)
- Raise Responder's suit with 4 card support (or 3 card support if Hearts were bid by Responder)
- Rebid your opening major suit if $6+$ cards in the suit
- Bid a new 4+ card suit
- Bid 3NT with 16-17 HCPs and where the above points do not fit
- Bid 2 NT which can be 12-15 or 18-21 HCPs - sometimes called the default rebid

## Responder's 2nd bid

- Raise Opener's 1st suit
- Raise Opener's 2nd suit
- Rebid Responder's suit (must be $6+$ cards)
- Bid NT

## How will Opener know whether Responder's 1 NT is 6-9 or $10-11 \mathrm{HCP}$ ?

## Responder's $\underline{2 n d}$ bid shows range and shape (3 different bids)

- Do you have 6-9 HCP (find a place to stop)?
- Bid 2 of Opener's Major to show 3-card support
- Pass Opener's second suit with an 8-card fit
- Bid new suit to show no fit and a $\underline{6+\text { card suit }}$
- Do you have 10-11 HCP (find a place to invite)?
- Jump to 3 of Opener's Major with 3-card support
- Raise Opener's 2nd suit with a known 8-card fit (5-card support in a Minor or 4-card support in a Major)
- Bid 2NT with no fit


## Opener's rebid after Responder bids 1 NT Forcing

- 12-15 HCP
- Bid a new suit at the 2 level in a lower ranking suit
- Rebid your major suit with 6+ cards
- If bidding a minor suit, it only promises 3 in that suit
- $16-17 \mathrm{HCP}$
- Bid 2 NT with a balanced hand
- Jump to 3 of your major with $6+$ cards
- 18-21 HCP
- Bid 3 NT with a balanced hand
- Bid 4 of your major with $6+$ cards
- Jump shift to second suit with $4+$ cards in that suit

- Pass Opener's second suit with an 8-card fit
- Bid new suit to show no fit and a $\underline{\mathbf{6 +}} \mathbf{c a r d}$ suit
- With 10-11 HCP (find a place to invite)?
- Jump to 3 of Opener's Major with 3-card support
- Raise Opener's 2nd suit with a known 8-card fit (5-card support in a Minor or 4-card support in a Major)
- Bid 2NT with no fit

## Opener bids 1 Major

Responder's first bid - Requirements to initiate 2/1 GF

- Must have $12+$ HCP
- Can only bypass 4 card suits going up the line if the suit being bid is longer in length
- Opener bids $1 \vee$. As Responder, you have 4 Spades and 5 Diamonds. Bid 2
- Opener bids $1 \mathbf{~}$. As Responder, you have 4 Diamonds and $4+$ Spades, bid 1 s . (More important to tell partner about spades.)
- If Opener bids $1 \stackrel{\wedge}{4}$, and Responder wants to bid Hearts, must have $5^{+}$ $\checkmark$ to initiate $2 / 1$
- Opponents have not bid other than Pass


## Opener's 2nd bid

- Jump to 3 of your major with $16+$ HCP \& a six-card suit or longer
- Raise Responder's suit with 4 card support (or 3 card support if Hearts were bid by Responder)
- Rebid your opening major suit if $6+$ cards in the suit
- Bid a new $4+$ card suit
- Bid 3NT with 16-17 HCPs and where the above points do not fit
- Bid 2 NT which can be 12-15 or 18-21 HCPs - sometimes called the default rebid


## Responder's 2nd bid

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- Rebid your major suit with $6+$ cards
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- $16-17 \mathrm{HCP}$
- Bid 2 NT with a balanced hand
- Jump to 3 of your major with $6+$ cards
- $18-21 \mathrm{HCP}$
- Bid 3 NT with a balanced hand
- Bid 4 of your major with $6+$ cards
- Jump shift to second suit with $4+$ cards in that suit
