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SHORT AND SWEET, THE MYSTERIOUS K2

Your editor was sitting next to Philippe Mathieu from Guadeloupe. He and his partner Dominique Gerin were the top qualifiers to reach Final A.

Jaime Carrera risked his life overcalling with a four card suit on the 2-level. But right he was, when Claudia Herrera led her ♦A and continued the suit against 4♠. After cashing a third diamond Carrera played a fourth as well. Jack-third or Queen-double of trumps would be enough to even kill 4♠.

Not this time, but picking up three tricks already was a great score for East-West. Without a diamond lead declarer had a fairly easy road to twelve tricks, ruffing a club in dummy and pitching two diamonds on the top hearts.



Point of interest

In my country a new type of opening gains popularity: 2♥, showing exactly a 5-card heart and three or four spades, 5-10 HCP. On this board South could open 2♥ and North would jump rightaway to 4♠. Short and sweet and no clue for East what to lead.

Last February this opening bid was described in IMP, the Dutch magazine for advanced players, by Joris van Lankveld, a junior World Champion. Joris called his 2♥ opening 'K2' after the mysterious K2 Himalaya mountain.

Against 4♠ doubled West led a top diamond, ruffed in dummy. Spade to Jack and Ace and est fired back the ♥2, low from dummy. East won the Queen and instantly returned a low heart. With the favourable club lay-out declarer has no problem, but he doesn't know that.

Carlos Pellegrini's heart return was develish and the best he could do. Who had the ♥A? Philippe Mathieu was on crossroads. He finally pitched a club, winning the heart in dummy, played a spade to his King and played a club. West won ♣A, but declarer was plainsailing for ten tricks.

South led a low heart to the King of North who returned ♥10 to Q and A. The only defence is to proceed with a low spade to the Queen and continue in spades. When South however played back a heart Claudie Lespinasse took the trick and cashed Ace and King of clubs, hoping for the best. The Jack dropped and declarer was home. Moreover she finessed the ♦K for her eleventh trick. Pairs is pairs, isn't it?
