We are delighted to welcome world star Peter Fredin here at the Panama bridgefestival. However Peter means Work! With him around, the press should be on the double. He always has interesting hands and great stories.

Take for instance this deal he shared with me at the breakfast table at the El Panama Hotel. The hand comes from an early round of this year's Vanderbilt in Saint Louis, USA. His partner was Björn Fallenius with Johann Upmark and Fredrik Nyström as team mates.

Nobody vulnerable, being the dealer Peter Fredin opened 1♥ with:

♠ 2 ♥ K 9 8 7 3 ♦ A J ♣ A 9 8 5 2

The bidding continued:

* natural, game forcing

** spades and diamonds, 5/6 or 6/5 (no 5/5)

After his partner's 2♣ Fredin fell in love with his hand. He meant 3♠ as shortness in spades; Hopefully his partner was at the same wavelength. Anyway, when Fallenius doubled 4♠ Peter had to make a bid.

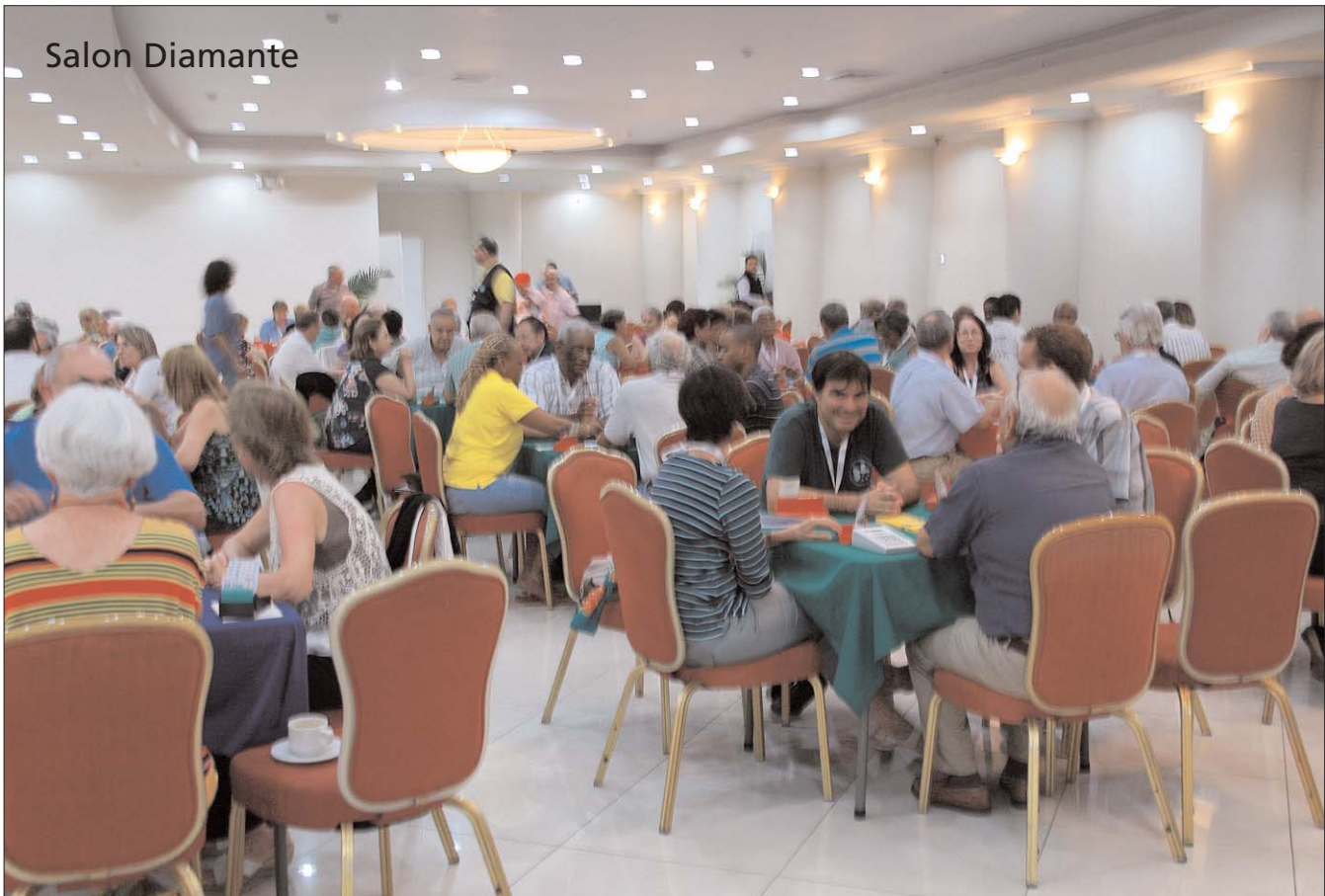

FREDIN FILM, PART 2

As South Peter Fredin had:

♠ 2 ♥ K 9 8 7 3 ♦ A J ♣ A 9 8 5 2

The double of 4♠ showed defence, probably soft values with no aces. Due to East's 2NT it was highly likely that East had a stiff heart and that a heart ruff would kill 5♣ (lacking two aces and a ruff). Altogether enough reasons for Peter to pass to 4♠ doubled.

Fallenius led the ♥Q and dummy came down:

Declarer won the first trick with his ♥A and advanced a low diamond. Partner followed with the nine (high-low odd number of cards), declarer played the King and Peter won the Ace. It looks like defence will score two diamond tricks, a club and an unknown number of spades. Before you go any further, what do we know about partner's hand by now?

Against 4♠ doubled North has led the ♥Q to declarer's Ace. A diamond followed to King and Ace and at this point South already has pretty accurate view of all 52 cards. Due to the ♦9 North seems to have Queen-third of diamonds. His heart holding is probably Queen-double, in clubs he must have King Jack-fifth, so he must have King-Jack-third in spades, because he bid 2/1 game forcing and therefore needs to have at least 12 HCP. He may have King-Queen of spades, but not the Ace. Otherwise his double in a forcing situation would have make no sense. And of course North is limited to three spades, otherwise he would have started the bidding with 1♠ in stead of 2♣.

If declarer could play spades from hand to dummy he might deep-finesse losing only one trump trick. Therefore Peter realized declarer should be prevented to come to hand. But how to organize the defence?

Read hereunder how Peter and Björn brilliantly continued.

Peter and Björn found the only way to defend 4♠ minus two. At trick three he reached his partner in clubs by underleading his Ace. Winning the ♣K Björn exactly knew what was going on and played a heart back. Declarer ruffed in dummy and exited with a diamond. Peter won the Jack and tabled the ♥K.

On that card North pitched his ♦Q! Now there was no way declarer could reach his hand and therefore still had to lose two spade tricks. NS +300 was a well deserved result after careful bidding followed by a brilliant defence.

Three points of interest:

1. A heart ruff indeed kills 5♣.
2. At the other table declarer played 4♠ doubled as well. He also went down two when on a different bidding and defence he decided to play ♠A and spade.
3. If in stead of playing a diamond declarer begins with a spade he might escape with one down.
