

Tricks & Treats

For Members of the Columbia Bridge Club

From the BOARD: The last CBC Board meeting was held at 6PM, December 8, 1999 at the Lizard's Thicket on Forest Drive across from the Richland Mall. The CBC Board of Directors requested that the following letter from Jack Wilkinson, Conduct, Rules and Ethics Chair be printed in the CBC Newsletter:

"The Columbia Bridge Club provides a paid certified director for all games at CBC. The director has various duties but generally his job is to ensure pleasant conditions for all players. He collects card fees, assigns player to tables, establishes the movement, distributes the boards, handles scoring, maintains order, posts results and resolves irregularities.

Bridge is a formal, intellectual, competitive game and disputes and irregularities arise. These include such things as dropping a card face up, bidding out of turn, hesitating, reneging, making an inadequate claim, disputing the result of the hand, etc.

The players may feel the room temperature is too high or low, are being disturbed by others, the lights are too low, or that a player is being abusive.

Under any such circumstances, the director should be called. This is done by raising a hand and saying in a clear pleasant voice "Director, please". The director should appear. He will announce "How may I help you?" or some such. The person who called the director should explain the situation. The other players at the table should remain silent. The director will ask to hear from each in turn if necessary. Correction of irregularities is covered by the laws and proprieties of bridge. Over the last 75 years or so, the most equitable response has been established for almost any situation.

Many players fail to call the director when an irregularity occurs. I assume they are afraid they will unduly disturb him or be humiliated by him. DO NOT accept a ruling given by a player at the table. Often this "helpful" ruling is incorrect. Call the director immediately when a irregularity occurs. Otherwise the situation may deteriorate jeopardizing a fair ruling. The directors' job is to resolve irregularities; if not called, he cannot. Please help him."

In follow-up to this letter, perhaps you have seen the following excerpts at the Bridge Center regarding *dummies rights*, *responsibilities*, *and limitations*, as well as *contested claims* when a trump is outstanding. These are purportedly from <u>The Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge</u> regarding Dummy:

- . Dummy may ask declarer, but not a defender, when he has failed to follow to a trick.
 - 2. Dummy may try to prevent any irregularity by declarer, i.e. leading from the wrong hand or turning his trick in the wrong direction.
 - 3. Dummy may not advise declarer nor may opponents advise each other that previous tricks have been turned incorrectly.
 - 4. Once an irregularity has occurred, dummy may not draw attention to it until after the play of the hand is concluded.
 - 5. During the play of a hand, dummy may not touch, or nearly touch, or indicate any card without instruction from declarer. If dummy does so, the director should be called.
 - 6. Dummy may not initiate a call for the director during the play of the hand.
- 7. Dummy is entitled to give information in the directors' presence as to fact or law. Regarding Contested Claims:
 - 1. When there is an outstanding trump and a claim has been made, call the director.
 - 2. When the director is called, any doubtful points shall be resolved against the claimer. The director will award a trick or tricks to the opponents:
 - a. If claimer failed to mention outstanding trump.
 - b. If claimer could lose a trick to that trump, he must lose it, even if his play would have to be careless or inferior to do so.
