Dear Friends,

We come to you now as your representatives that you elected to handle the affairs of this mutual bridge club for this year 2001-2002. It has been obvious for over a year that we were going to have to tackle a very difficult task, that of stabilizing the finances of the Columbia Bridge Club. This was complicated by the possibility of moving. That possibility has been removed and the issue now can be dealt with on a standalone basis. The renovations to the club are not the cause of our financial problems. Had the work not been done, we would have arrived at the same position sometime down the road, but without the vastly improved playing conditions and having played the interval in the old deplorable conditions.

The last time card fees were raised, Ronald Reagan was President, there were two Germanys and only one Yugoslavia. Few had heard of either Saddam Husain or Bill Clinton. Card fees from Miami to Washington and all over South Carolina have risen far past the level of the CBC. For good reason: everything connected with the duplicate experience has risen in price. There is the cleaning service, coffee service, maintenance including plumbing and bug spraying, directors, computer paper, cards and all other game supplies, taxes, telephone, power, water, and everything else needed to have a site to play has gone up in price. There is also the matter of the sanction fees. Sanctions are not just for special games, but are the fees necessary on the regular games and just to renew our club franchise each year. All these goods and services have constantly risen in price while our entry fee stayed the same.

So we come to you with this solution: Beginning January 1, 2002, card fees for all games will be \$5.00 per person. However, it isn't all downside because we also include a few other things. Coffee will still be free, soft drinks will be provided at a reduced cost of .25 cents a can, no special sanction fees for any pairs games run by the club. That's right, Junior Fund games, NAOP games, Silver point Stac games, club charity games, ACBL Charity Games-all will be only \$5.00 per person. Your club gets healthy and at what cost to you? To the twice a week player, that dollar and a half raise runs \$12 a month. Five bucks for three and a half hours of entertainment is a bargain. See you at the club!
