We will be starting a series game on Monday nights with the first week in August. Simple rules. Best four of the six weeks percentage scores count. Must have a different partner for each of four games that you count. If you play with the same partner more than once, the first score counts.

June started the NAOP club qualifying round. Last chances to qualify at the CBC in August.

Congratulations go out to Tom Balcerek the club's newest Life Master. Got the last 5-odd points at the Regional. James Blackwell!!! It isn't official yet, but Jim is now the club's newest Gold Life Master. He had a very good year last year, scoring almost 500 Master points and just continued his campaign into 2002. For those who have been asking-the update on players' recorded points will be mailed to the club during the second week of September.

Some have been asking about approaches to bidding against various opponents' styles. OKhere's my view for what it's worth: (Talk these things over with your partner before trying them in public.) Against Big Club, Big Diamond, Relay systems or weak No-Trump approaches, it is the opening bid and responses that carry most of their load-deny them this, their biggest advantage, if you can. Get in as light as possible. Open any hand with 11 count and holding an Ace or King. Use preempts that may not be as solid or as long as you might like-anything to disrupt that strong opening sequence. Listen to the explanation of the bids if you can't do the previous. Form a picture of the hands they hold, look at your own and figure out what pard has. (never enough) Against Std. American or 2 over 1 players, the tactic is almost the reverse (against good ones) Open solid values, even in 3rd chair. Ace, King fourth will do. Eleven in two Aces and a King is a minimum. Overcall only good suits. AKxx will do on the One level. As a matter of fact, it's almost mandatory to overcall a suit that good. If you overcall a queen/jack fifth or King/10 fifth suit at the two level just because you have 10-12 points, I hope you also have a high pain threshold. If you can show two suits with a double or cue bid, do it. Remember, no bids come with a guarantee. They're still going to win some, but these approaches should help.

The new Palmetto Pre-empts are on the table by the door. Several good play problems as well as a good article on psychs. You can read the whole article for yourself but I would like to endorse emphatically one point he has: "It is unethical to psych against a novice." Try it against Joyce and me if you simply must.

Do people who snap their cards do it because they don't know how much it irritates other players or because they do know?

Your chairman, Margaret Hill would like to thank all the players and especially all the committees that made the Columbia Regional a great time. I'd like to thank all my partners and team mates. We weren't uniformly successful, but we did have a good time. (And some success)
