Only double a cue bid of your suit if you want partner to lead something else. I had a whole paragraph built around the previous sentence ready to go until something strange happened at my table. And it happened again and again and again. All in the month of June. What is this reluctance to lead trump when you have a bad suit? I watched a declarer who reached 4S on a stayman sequence lose all 5 outstanding trumps (with a 3-2 split no less) when her suit was QTxx across from xxxx. I watched a declarer lose 2 top tricks, two ruffs and a finess he never should have been put in the position of taking because he refused to lead trumps that were 9xxx across from Kxxx when he had a running 6 card side suit. When you have to cross-ruff to make the hand, fine. But when you have the Holy City and all you have to do is lose top trumps....get a trump on the table, lose them already, and cash the side winners without letting opponents score those spot card trumps!!!! You trying to make your partner crazy?

We are in the process of setting up two free two hour seminars on match point bidding with Greg Mackey, the winner of this year's Bob McMann trophy for match point game percentage. The first session will be 10:30 A.M. on Saturday July 19 and the second on Saturday August 16 also at 10:30. I enjoy playing with Greg.
