Our Christmas Tree is from the tree farm of Harold Moore. Would you bring an ornament to hang on the tree before our Christmas party Thursday 12/11? Party starts at 6:00 with a social hour. Dinner about 7:00. Bridge (this is not a StaC event) will follow about 8:00. Bring a side dish, dessert or appetizer. Please sign up for one of these on a list by the back door. Club will furnish the entree and the bridge is free.

Spotlight event for December is the Stac events that run from Monday the 8th through Sunday the 14th. All Stac events are **Open** though they will be stratified. Overall winners in the entire District will be in for nice awards. Overall 1st A is usually around 20 points, B over 10 and C about 5. Entries are \$12/pr.

Congratulations to our newest Bronze Life Master, Bill Fogleman. It's not official yet, but a count shows our Club VP with over 500 points around the beginning of November.

A cue bid of opponents' suit is a handy call but remember, you are giving partner the green light to bid at the game level. You are even telling him it is desirable to do so. So don't do it if you don't mean it. Take a look at common situations you would do this. Partner overcalls and you have an (almost) opener. Cueing the opponents suit says "Bid game in your suit if you have an opener." Most obvious is Michaels. You're showing two suits and either a hand strong enough to make game with a fit in either of two suits or one where it is desirable to take a save against opponents' game. (If you are in the middle, just bid your higher ranking suit first). In another case, a power auction, you may cue bid to ask partner to bid 3 NT with a stopper in opponents' suit. (Most pairs play that a cue bid after you've made a negative double the previous round shows, instead of asks for, a stopper.) Another situation is a cue bid of a weak two opener. This should not be a "Michaels" call. This should ask for a 3 NT bid with a stopper in the weak two suit opener. To show a two suited hand over a weak two by opponents, bid the four level of your 5-card minor. This shows also a 5-card holding in the other major. You are giving up a lot of information to make these bids if you wind up on defense, so be sure that the option you are handing partner is worth it. Sometimes partner will deem it best not to bid at the game level-you just have to trust him to make that judgment call.

Congratulations Wayne Hollingsworth. With points won in Greenville he has now over 800 for 2003.

We had 11 tables for the Pro/Am game Nov. 20. Everyone seemed to have a good time. We're going to do it again Thursday Dec. 18. I already circled it on your calendar. Let's bring some Christmas food we don't want left over.

Here is a sequence from the other night that has two different schools of thought-whenever it is alerted, you should ask. It went thus:

LHO	Partner	RHO	Me
pass	1 Heart	2 diamonds	2 Spades

Some pairs play this as a "negative free bid" and not forcing. We were playing the more accepted way as constructive-forcing one round. The '2 Spade' call shows either a hand with a spade suit I can bid by myself at the 3 level (or bid NT) or a decent alternative contract but also holding heart support. If you have a hand that doesn't fit in one of these two classes, a bid can buy a lot of trouble. If partner doesn't like spades, he just bids anything but support and I'll find another contract-Unless I have the big rebiddable suit. Now if I was a passed hand, that would be certainly heart support or I would have opened a weak two in first or second chair with a big Spade suit and somewhere under 10 HCP. I'm showing my big help suit in case partner opened a minimum. Mostly these auctions look like:

Negative free bids should be alerted. If they are being played, confirm a fit with partner if you have one. Opponents are looking down the barrel of **perhaps** a complete misfit. **Think double!!!** If you go quietly over a negative free bid, you are being had. Say "Baaa", you are about to be sheared.
