The question "Anything I can do quickly to improve my game?" I have a few suggestions, yes. Some of them have nothing to do with bidding, play or defense, but I guarantee positive results. Number one: Remember that bridge is fun-serious competition, yes, but also recreation of a high order. A corollary sometimes overlooked: Anything you do to reduce the pleasure of the other players will reduce your own. I can explain at length, but trust me, it's true. Number two: This is a game of concentration. You watch the spots, you remember bidding, you count cards. A corollary often overlooked by some otherwise very fine players: You don't do anything to break your own partner's concentration. You don't talk about the last hand when he's trying to bid this one. You don't talk as dummy. Don't make comments about what you were thinking during the auction as you table the dummy. Your demeanor on defense and as dummy should be uniformly calm and undemonstrative. (See number one) Number three: Hold your cards back. Relax the death grip that rounds the hand. Pick your card to play by the upper corner, not by grabbing it by the middle, folding half of your hand back for all to see. (You would think this was obvious-but it obviously isn't). Number Four-(and folks if you violate this one, I don't want to hear about it) No table rulings. Something out of the regulation happens, call the game Director. Even with one at the table. You'll notice I always do when I'm playing. That's what we're here for-we need the exercise anyway. Don't feel bad later about a result you feel shouldn't have happened-call now and make sure it's right. Don't feel victimized or intimidated by the other players. (See number one-don't try intimidation either-directors don't like it)
