A couple of views of the "Alert" procedure. First from an editorial in the July issue of The Bridge World. This concerns the possibility of unauthorized information due to alerting or non alerting of agreements that the bidder has blown. "In principle, information from partner's earlier behavior (including errors) should be authorized if only because bridge would be essentially unplayable otherwise..... A sponsoring organization that adopts the Alert procedure ... to assist in the process of method announcements must accept its shortcomings along with its benefits. It is embarrassing when tournament organizers insist on a particular technique, then tell players who use it correctly that they have thereby transmitted unauthorized information....Transmission of unauthorized information is an irregularity. Opener does nothing irregular by correctly announcing his partnership agreements. The state of someone's mind cannot change behavior from regular to irregular" Second view: Playing on a Thursday night: opponents bid 1 heart-I double (4-1-4-4, 16 HCP)-3 Hearts-partner passes, opener passes-I comment-"You aren't alerting 3 Hearts?" "No. should I?" "Depends on your partnership agreement." "It's preemptive" "Then you should have alerted it before my partner bid." "Well what are you going to do about it?" Coming from that person, who played a part in another of a recent string of unhappy (for me) failure to alert incidents, caused me to reflect. I've done nothing but get hurt trying to make this practice work. "That's a very good question." So I shrugged, passed and made the opening lead. Two over-justice!! Hmm, 23 minutes here, less than an hour to Aiken...

Marty Sez....."You don't need a stopper in opponents' suit to <u>balance</u> with 1 NT. Because you are reluctant to sell out at the one level at matchpoints, all you need is 10-14 HCP. Once your RHO passed the opening bid, you know your partner must have some values. He'll often have good cards in their suit. If you don't have a suit to bid or the right shape to double, a stopperless 1 NT is your only alternative to pass." By the way-as a passed hand, you only need 9-11 to balance back in with 1 NT despite not having a stopper in opener's suit.

And once again, pairs where both partners were under 700 took 3 of the top eight spots and won at least one direction. One of the more popular events on our calendar.
