## ALERT!!!

We're having an Open House on Sunday September 18 to encourage new members to join our club. We need your help and participation. If you would bring just one new bridge player to the open house it would make a big difference.

While playing in the Charlotte Club Championship last month, Joyce and I ran into three auctions by opponents that went "one of a major, two of the same major-four of the major" A fourth auction where Joyce slipped in a two level overcall belongs in the same category-they all went down at least one. I see it in over/under games, also. This is one auction every advancing player should drop like a bad habit. If you are willing to commit to game over any 6 (or maybe less?) point hand your partner has to respond, why aren't you opening 2 Clubs in the first place? Talk it over with partner and use an asking bid next time. We use over 1 Heart-two Hearts, an artificial 2 Spades to ask for a cue bid of the lowest ranking suit responder would accept a game invitation in (a 2 NT response to the 2 spades asking would show Spade help) Over 1 Spade-Two Spades, 2 NT is the artificial ask. We ask with an off shape 15+ opener and respond positively with only the top end of our minimum two level response. (good 7 or 8-9) It limits damage when we won't make and gets us to game when we need to be there. Criteria for positive response should be agreed before hand-usually include a quick trick requirement, distribution and support elements. A hand including an ace and a king is a lot better than one holding 4 Queens and a Jack for instance. Will a stiff qualify as help? Or are you looking for a high card placement only? In limited games you have "field protection" for 1-2-4 auctions-but you won't have that in an open game. Practice will hone your judgment in these auctions. "What's goin' on!!? I ain't got a clue!!!" You may have heard (or may not) about the pro golfer recently who after teeing off, just went to his ball and played it through without regard to whether he or his playing companion was "out". This broke about sixty-eleven different rules of conduct and etiquette and the rules committee wanted to talk to him. He didn't care who he ticked off in return. Well, the stakes may be lower, but the feelings are just as intense at a bridge game. It is unsportsman-like to be consistently late-even by as little as a minute-leaving your table at the end of the round. The time element is part of the conditions of contest. Even if you're not done talking yet-be ethical enough to realize your time is up and leave at the end of the round. Last reminder: Don't keep the whole room waiting for results at the end. That is rude and inconsiderate. (The last round is no longer than any other round)
