Your Board and committee members need your help and participation. If you would bring just one new bridge player to the open house or otherwise help out, it would make a big difference. See Alice, Irma, Brent, Sheelagh or Karen Coulter. Get in to the box at the front of the playing area, the name and address-phone number-of those who might like to join us.

Bridge is a great game with the scope for strategy that it has. Last month I discussed the asking bids that Joyce and I used as two-over-one players. Our 2S or 2NT asks give a minimum away to interference bidding or subsequent defensive strategy. Standard American bidders find short suit or help suit game tries more useful. Big Club (and even more exotic systems) have their own conventions. It is possible to make very sophisticated (and expensive) mistakes in any system. What you want to do is work out with your partner which you want to play. What you don't want to do is never turn down an invitation. That's fine for opponents-I expect my partners to use some judgment. People who always bid on are going to stick you with bad results sometimes-it happens-but generally they will be with the field when it's right to bid and you won't lose much if anything. When it's wrong-and it will be wrong lots more often than the number of times they stuck you for bad results-you are going to make a ton of points. (If you can play defense-that's how good players win) Generally experts suggest a partnership stretch to get to a game. You get best results if it is stretched on only one side of the table-stretch your assets to invite a game-only accept the invite if you are comfortable in the range of your bidding-not dead minimum for what you've shown.
