If you can, check out the video David Bykowski made for the event. Our Fearless Leader Alice Moore put quite a good team together didn't she? Now it's up to us to carry through.

As promised words of wisdom from Brian Lipscomb: When to re-bid a bad 5-card Spade suit as responder holding 6-10 High Card points after your partner opens one of a minor and re-bids one no trump: We're talking suits that are five to the ten, five to the Jack or five to the Queen. The Auction:

partner Opp. You Opp. 1 Minor Pass 1 Spade Pass 1 NT Pass ?

The key is your holding in partner's minor suit. If you hold 2 cards in partner's suit-pass. If you hold 3 or more-bid 2 Spades. Now why is that? If you hold only a two card fit with his minor, you have more cards in the unbid suits. That's better for no trump. This applies to hands that are 5-3-3-2 and 5-3-2-3 and 5-2-3-3. Don't be afraid to defend if they try to outbid you on these hands. (Ed. Note: passing 1NT will many times tempt opponents to bail you out as they try to play a two level contract on hands that fit no better than yours and 20 HCP - or less. You are now where you want to be-on defense and probably going plus-if partner has 3 good spades with you-he may raise to 2 Spades if opponents compete. If he doesn't-you are better off on defense)

There will be a Unit game Wednesday noon 10/12 sanction # UC 510160A1. Everyone come.

The Instant Matchpoint event is the best test of bridge around. Everyone can get a bad board-and everyone can get a good board. Matchpoints are already awarded, you have to measure yourself against the possible results. It delivered the winners' Gold points to pairs who didn't really need them, but the event also delivered an analysis book to all the participants that's worth its weight in gold (points) to its readers. There might have been better analysis of an event than Richard Pavlicek delivered the last 19 years, but I can't think of when. For instance Board 16: He effortlessly made the point on game tries we picked up playing the south Florida pros while we lived in Miami-also lead strategy against them (as well as fourth suit forcing auctions). Board 7: In E/W spade contracts, you're always going to lose one trump trick, you have to guard against 4-1 breaks. When to raise responder's suit. (If he'd been at my table, he might also have made a point about using cards you can't afford to let go of as signals) The running joke is Mad Cow bids. Check Board 29 you inverted minor fans. Very effective. The entire booklet is informative, entertaining and will amply repay the time you spend to read it. Oh, yeah, the game results:

Hoist on my own petard. Tip # 524 by Edwin Kantar "Don't be afraid to bid against experts. That's one reason why they win so often-opponents are beaten before they get to the table. Also, experts don't like defending against preempts any more than you do." So-a recent Monday night as my best partner and I were headed to fourth place: Tootsie Holland allowed as she didn't like our preemptive style-but that didn't keep her from correctly electing to defend my first preempt and enjoying the fruits of her own aggressive bidding as I made the wrong decision at the slam level on a second hand. Later, over my partner's 1 diamond opening, Sheelagh Young sticks in "4 Hearts", I look at a flat 14 and elect a double-minus 590. Sallie Blackwell did the same a few hands later-she collected three over tricks as we went minus 890, partner holding an 18 count!! No call carries a guarantee, but you bid like champs, ladies. I saw John, Ed and Brent smiling as their partners cleaned our clocks. A tip of the hat and-"Another day".
