- For all our new players and a brush-up for old club members, a few words on calling the director. First: (and this is important) call the director anytime you feel something has gone off-track. Really, it's OK-we don't have too many thin directors and they need the exercise. Better safe. Second: Call at the time it happens (e.g. call at the hesitation-not when it's his partner's turn to bid or after his partner has bid) We'd rather be called early while it's still simpler to rule. Third: Don't accept a table ruling from another player. Some of them don't know the rules as well as they think they do. Hey, I always call-so do the other club game directors. You watch. Fourth: When calling, put your hand in the air and in a firm voice say "Director" or "Director, please" Don't be angry, or worse, snippy about it; just keep the hand up till the director sees you. Say 'director' rather than the first name so he knows he is being called in an official capacity not, for example, just to turn dummy's cards, sort a bid box, make coffee or fix the temperature. Fifth: The director doesn't need help in making the ruling. He will first listen to the person who called, then ask any questions he needs answered. Please: no interruptions or arguments that just slow things down. You're going to be ruled against sometimes when you think you shouldn't be. The director has a rule bookhe can read you the applicable Law at the table or discuss with you the reason for the ruling after the round or after the game. Some rulings can be appealed though not any made as a matter of Law(s).

For those of you who didn't think they needed their math classes after school: If you're in a contract needing at least two out of three finesses to work, your chances are 50-50 (Really!! For discussion of the math, catch me anytime) The odds on winning at least one of two finesses is 75%. The odds of winning two out of two finesses is only 25%. A common situation where you need -or want-three tricks:

you hold 6-4-2 and dummy has A-J-9-3

Odds are the King and Queen are split though you have a 25% chance of finding them both on side. But wait!! What if you lead toward dummy and when LHO plays low, you put in the 9? Finessing against the 10 all of a sudden makes you 50-50 (to get at least two tricks)-looking to win two out of three finesses (against the King, against the Queen and against the 10) rather than having to win two out of two.
