Easy bridge, presented and directed by Jeff Thomas, assisted by his wonderful wife Deborah (Who wrote this copy?) held their first classes each Tuesday starting in October. The first lessons were free for those under 20 points and little or no experience playing. Attendance was high and we began charging and giving out masterpoints at lesson five. You can check out the results on the bulletin board. We have had 45 visitors to Easy bridge with a usual attendance of 16 players each week. The class started with "this is a deck of 52 cards" and has progressed through many popular conventions. This is a diverse group whose enthusiasm makes it a pleasure to work with. The quiet during the presentation contrasts with the vigorous post mortems of hands that are played. The holidays have disrupted the schedule, but after review, Easy Bridge I will be finished and Easy Bridge II will start. Things your mother taught you that just aren't so. Consider the suit combination:

Dummy holds A-K-J-10-x

Your mama told you play one big honor in case the Queen is offside single. Sorry Mom. It's aggravating when it happens, but if the suit goes out badly, the queen is 10 times likely to be on-side fourth than it is to be offside single (if you have 6 in dummy and 2 in hand it is still 4 times more likely)-and you still lose to an original offside Q-x if you play Ace, then a second round finesse. If you play one top honor first, you can't even pick up (Q-x-x-x) on-side by taking a second round finesse. So just plan on taking two finesses.

Knowing things like the above is helpful often enough to make it worthwhile remembering. But if you remember the following, it will save you a whole lot more tricks. I cannot, as director, call attention to an irregularity I see as I walk around the floor. (This is straight from ACBL folks) I've seen declarer lead from the wrong hand, revokes, wrong defender leads. One memorable hand I watched first my declarer partner-then both defenders-revoke. No one notices. Today I also saw a declarer concede the last three tricks in a no trump contract when the Heart in her hand (on lead) was the only red card in the four hands to the last three tricks. I watched opponent rise on dummy on the third lead of a suit, declining to finesse against my partner-even though I showed out on the second round. Partner claims at trick eight one more for the A in dummy, conceding the rest-but the King drops stiff offside setting up two more in his handtough (his other cards are losers). Another partner wants to concede a trick to a card that defenders mistakenly covered with early. (Fortunately she couldn't) Saw one poor player leave three tricks high and dry in dummy because he wasn't watching when he dropped the stiff queen offside and he thought they weren't good. (Imagine what his partner said?) Watch the cards folks. Pay attention or pay the piper.
