Back when I was just starting duplicate play, I read an American captain's advice to his Bermuda Bowl team as it prepared for the Italian Blue Team: "Let them bid their system and we'll bid our cards." The Blue team won 10 or maybe 13 World Championships while the Americans won...hmmmm-zero? Over the last month I have run into a rash of partners (6 partners in 7 sessions) who over the auctions: Me (1 minor) Opp. 1 Heart or- Me 1 Club Opp. (1 Red suit) or- Me (1 Minor) Opp. Double have bid 1 Spade on the following spade holdings: 10 xxxx, KQxx, Axxx, KJxx, Qxxx, JTxx and 9xxx. The first two holdings are marginal, the rest run from unacceptable to ridiculous. Some local bridge icon once told players to do this and nothing can sway them from it. Bad advice. You have an opportunity here. This is not just interference, but a way to clarify your holding for your partner quickly. You have a negative double. There is 1 NT, and there is Pass and Redouble available if you have only 4 card suits. You are now in a very real sense an over caller. If you don't do this, the re-valuation of not just your hand but your partner's hand becomes just impossible. A bid of a suit at the one level (over interference) is 5 (or more) cards. What's the matter? You afraid you won't declare enough?!?!? Why not get to better contracts? You give your partner more information this way. The more he has, the better decisions he will make. Even experts give bad advice: Baseball's Ted Williams once told hitters that he always took the first pitch. Big league pitchers should have sent him pay checks for the next 40 years.
