From <u>"52 Facts of Bridge Life"</u> by Eddie Kantar. 1) When partner bids two suits and you have an equal number of cards in each suit, take partner back to the first suit even if it means increasing the level. Just do it!

You hold S-Axxx H-K9x D-Jxx C-xxx

Partner You 1 D 1 Spade

Bid 3 Diamonds. Raising hearts (see next tip) or passing partner's one round forcing reverse puts you back in kindergarten.

2) A direct raise of a second suit promises four card support (in blood).

You hold: S-xx H- A,10,x D- A,10,x C- K,10,xxx

Partner You
1 Spade 2 Clubs
2 Hearts ?

Re-bid 2NT showing 11-12 HCP. Don't even think of raising Hearts (this bid) with only three.

Importance of on-time play :Take Six: Special note people want results-you do not have forever to play the last round, just the same amount of time as any other round. Show some consideration for the other players and finish in the allotted time. Punctuality is a virtue. (I'm talking about by experienced players here) If the rounds are finished on time, everyone has a better time and I field fewer complaints behind the desk. If the last round finishes in time for everyone to check scores at the club, I have few corrections to make from phone calls after they check the scores on the Internet site at home. (and I don't have to change the Internet scores either). I have a bias toward having a game decided at the table, but I understand the reason for and endorse the 'three minute' rule the Board put in a few years ago. You should understand that I and the other directors will bend it a little if it's a fast pair declaring but not if someone who never declared a hand in under 7 minutes is at the wheel. Call that discrimination if you like-we are massively unmoved. Another consideration: 'No Play' is an adjusted score. The director is authorized to levy a procedural penalty for any action (or inaction) that leads to an adjusted score. (Ask to see the rule) Time is one of the conditions of contest. Do the best you can on three boards in 22 minutes. IF you have some time left over-THEN you can talk about it. There are available books of bridge puzzles with no time limit. The North player has a special responsibility here-You have several jobs to do to keep the game moving. Monitor the time, make out the scoring ticket and get it initialed. Do these things before anything-I mean anything, else. If you can't get these things done in a timely fashion, please do not be offended if the director insists you play EW the next few times out. I'm out of re-write time, so we'll go with this.

The last minute club (11:59 Wednesday mornings) is doing a lot better than the old 10 AM time. We run 6-9 tables usually. (The games like NAP or the ACBL charities draw the best). I like seeing the Tuesday and Friday players testing the water here.

We're thinking of tweaking the game time for the Friday 0-50 and 0-750 game to Noon from 12:30. The traffic if we get out in time (before 4 PM) is a whole lot easier to navigate. Let us

know what you think. Bernetha has a list-just put your name in one column or the other.
