**Facts of Bridge Life (Eddie Kantor)** #7) A takeout double by a passed hand shows 9-11 High card points with shortness in the opener's suit. If the opponents have bid two suits, the double promises at least four cards support for both unbids.

You hold S-AJxx H- xx D-KJ10xx C-xx

(You) South	West	North	East
Pass	1 Club	Pass	1 Heart

You show both suits with a double. Bidding 2 Diamonds risks losing a Spade fit.

8) A good idea when playing Blackwood is to count the king of the agreed suit as an Ace! This is called 'Key Card Blackwood". When using this convention, do not contract for slam unless you have at least 4 of the five 'Aces"

The Duke of Wellington once opined "The Battle of Waterloo was won on the playing fields of Eton." Consider the changing times-different battle arenas, different weapons and proficiencies. Think the Cold War was won at the bridge table? The Russians didn't have the national mania to play that we did, did they? Don't ever, ever say "It's only a game." in front of someone (like me) who knows better. Sun-Tzu in The Art of War observed "Defeated warriors go to war and try to win. Victorious warriors learn how to win, then go to war." Check out the lessons and seminars available at the club. Almost everything is available from non-playing beginners and Intermediate/Novice instruction with Mary Townhill and Ellen Oliver to seminars on Monday mornings with George Nichols or Saturday mornings with Brian Lipscomb. Remember, Brian's daughter Shannon's team beat his in the top bracket KO finals at the Regional. In that same vein: I was looking around the room the Friday following the 0-750 Over/Under game. The Over/Under game had been split at 125 master points. That following Friday, the 0-750 section had in it two pairs that had started the year in the 0-50 game. There were also 3 players in the 750 section that were eligible to play in the under 50 game. Looking further, I saw that there were also several players in the 750 section that could have played in the under 50 section (had we had a game like that) in 2005. So to anyone under 50 master points: Don't worry about moving up. You'll see a lot of familiar faces, friends you were playing against whom you'll now be re-joining at a little higher level.
