Say your partner opens 1NT (15-17) and you have 18 HCP, balanced. There are at lesast 33 points between the two hands so bid 6NT! If leaping so high scares you, go to a mirror and say 6NT out loud. Do it! 58) Best Bonus tip of all: Don't bid the same values twice. Don't play with someone you don't like. Don't scream at your partner and don't forget to use these tips unless you want to spend the rest of your life struggling to get to first base....Amen Copies of all 58 tips available on request.

For those Open players who may want another game to play in, there is a game in Camden Tuesdays at 7 PM (first Tuesday Charity game each month) and Batesburg at 6:30 Tuesdays. There is a Sunday afternoon game at Tricity Leisure Center Sundays at 1:30.

We will NOT have a 4th GNT qualifying session on Saturday, April 18. We will be having our regular pair game instead.

The Tricitity Sectctional is at the Leisure Center starting Friday April 3rd. Look to your partners soon. There are no games at the club on Friday the 3rd or Saturday the 4th.

The Camden Sectional is April 24-26-no games at the club that weekend either.

One of the most common rulings is opening lead out of turn. If it is the opening lead, declarer has five options, subsequent violations have (obviously) only four:

A) Declarer may face his hand and let partner play the contract.

B) Declarer may accept the lead and have the dummy tabled before he plays as second hand to the opening trick.

(Director Harry Goldwater opined that if opponents didn't know who's lead it was, they probably didn't know what to lead either, making one of these first two options attractive)

C) Offender's partner may be required to lead the suit. (Illegal lead is picked up and any card offender has in that suit may be played.)

D) Offender's partner may be prohibited from leading that suit so long as he retains the lead. (Illegal lead is picked up and played at offender's option)

E) Offender's partner may be allowed to lead anything they wish including the suit of the illegal lead. (Illegal lead stays on the table and is played at first legal opportunity) If defender has a penalty card on the table (say a low spot) it is entirely ethical for you to use the provisions of this rule to your advantage. Examples: If you think he also has the ace of that suit, you can cash a king that lies underneath that ace he's prohibited from playing till the penalty card is gone. If you have A-x-x in one hand and K-J-x-(x) in front of the penalty card, a finesse for the queen is a winner. (Honest to God, some people are such rote players that I've seen them play the ace first and then lose to the queen sitting behind the jack.)

Bridgemate scoring: The score will always be in relation to the side playing the contract. If E/W is in 4 Hearts down one vulnerable, the result will read "4H -100 40%"-that's 40% for E/W and thus 60% to N/S (so far). If a N/S pair on the same board was in 4 Spades down one vulnerable, it would read on the traveler as "N 4S -100" Those scores would be on opposite sides and thus not be getting the same percentage. The "No Play' key is the "0" or 10 key. The director will usually make this entry for you. This is not the same as a "Pass Out". If you pass a board out, that contract is the "K" key. (See the green "Pass"?)
