We've sold the old club!! After consideration for the shape it's in, the sale was \$150,000 minus the fees-call it \$135-140,000 net to the club.

Some of my recent discussions concerned a rash of distributional hands:

How do you handle 5-5 in the majors when your partner opens 1 NT? Like this beauty from Batesburg? ♠ 9-8-6-5-2 ♥ J-7-4-3-2 ♦ K ♣ 7-6. Your partner has 3 cards in at least one of the majors and, believe me, he does not want to play 1NT. Start with Stayman-if he shows a 4-card major, fine-Pass. If he responds 2♦, then bid 2♥. He will then pass or correct to 2♠ if he has 3 Spades and only 2 Hearts. (This also handles bad 5-4 hands) With a little better hand that you want to invite a major suit game, 2 ♥ transfer to Spades and then re-bid 3♥. If you want to force to game, you have two routes: a 2♥ transfer to Spades and then re-bid 4 Hearts or 2) A 2♦ transfer to Hearts and re-bid 2 Spades. The first is a sequence where you're only interested in game-the second leaves open a slam try. With a hand 5-4 in the majors, there is the Smollen convention: start with Stayman-if you get a 24 response, bid three of your 4-card major. This allows partner to play a 5-3 fit in your other major or 3 NT. Don't ever open 1 NT with 2-2 in the majors or (God help you) a singleton. How do you bid a hand that is 5-5 (or longer) in the black suits if you're opening bidder? I would prefer to open 1♣ with 5-5 and re-bid Spades twice. My favorite partners can't handle that so I don't. But this beauty (unforgettable by anyone who played it) is one I open 1♠: ♠K-J-9-5-4 ♥ -- ♦ 10 ♠ K-Q-9-8-7-5-4. Don't let anyone tell you this is a nine count and not an opening hand. Most players will provisionally rate it at 16 (some who count length and shortness will tell you 23-25-just back away from them slowly) Opening the lower ranking suit saves bidding room and you'll need a lot of it. If your partner's next call is a preemptive 2 ♥, your call of 2♠ immediately gives him the picture. (He's denied 4 spades so you aren't bidding a four card suit-so your clubs must be even longer or you'd have opened 1♠). Note that if your distribution is 5-5 (or more) with at least one red suit-you should open the major first unless the disparity is at least two cards or there is a material difference in the quality of the suits. (eg: \$J-8-7-5-3 ♥ A \$ A-K-Q-6-4-3 \$ 10 > open 1\$) You want to bid a lot with this kind of distribution, but it's important that your high cards are in the suits. In the previous example, the ace-jack fifth of spades and a stiff heart gives the same point count but a much better hand. You'll also need at least a minimal fit with partner.
