"If you keep doing what you've always done, you're going to keep getting what you've always gotten." This applies to bridge players as much as to anyone else it seems; even with the mind stretching that the Open field game requires. What brought this to mind was listening to a group of 'C' players who've met with some success talk about how they never double anyone. If you don't double, people push you around and steal you blind. Watch the balancing on the part scores. Quick 2/1 fix for this: If your partner opens 1 of a major, use the forcing 1NT and a delayed raise with either 2 or 3 card support and 5-7 HCP. Raise immediately with 8-9 HCP and 3 card support. If they balance with a double, drop a Redouble card if you hold prime cards (Ace or Kings) for your bid or pass if you hold mostly Queens and Jacks for your 8-9. Partner now knows whether to go quietly, take the push or exact a penalty double. Some players have their partners trained to never let a two of a major contract play. You can't keep them out of an auction-so invite them in!! For them I suggest using weak sounding auctions with an extra King or Ace and when they get in with their balance, use the ax. You'll eat one once in a while, but on balance (pun intended) you'll be way-y-y-y ahead. Especially effective when they are red. Notes on the match point logic: 1) If you let them play their balance bid, you're looking at minus to a strong minus match point result. 2) If you take the push all the time, you're losing on hands where you're one too high-there's no way to gain. 3) Doubling beats all the pairs that beat the balancing bid undoubled. If they are red you probably get a top. If the doubled contract makes-you completely lose your bad board MP's. That's anywhere from a 2-1 to a 4-1 payoff. Of course, you have to be able to play defense. Some have told me this is really mean and nasty-to them I say "Thank-you-I try". Of course if opponents were playing nice, they wouldn't have come in over your 2-level bid now would they? That's the way the game is played. "The only way this doesn't work is if one of them is honest-and I make that 10 to one against." Walter Matthau as Sorrowful Jones "Little Miss Marker"
