I was just looking around the room at a recent Friday afternoon game: 8 tables in the 0-1000 and 3 tables in the 0-100. Started counting-5 people in the 0-1000 that were still eligible to play in the 0-100, 15 of the 32 players in the 0-1000 that had started in the 0-100. I started counting up the people 'aged out" (or about to be) of the game altogether and now played on other afternoons or evenings. Those players on the other side of the room or the upper strata aren't the 'big guys' – they're you- sooner or later. Try that idea on for size!

It's time to start thinking about election of new officers. The nominating committee this year will be: (Chair) Emily Lamphere, Joyce Lauterbach, Frances Lawton, Gwen Beckman and Carolyn Cromer. They will present a slate of candidates and further nominations may be made from the floor at the annual membership meeting in May. If you're available, or know someone you believe should be on the board in some capacity-let a member of the committee know.

The Tricity Sectional kicks off Friday March 12 with Stratified Pairs at 1:00 and 7:00. There are three pairs games on Saturday at 9:00, 1:00 and 7:00. Swiss on Sunday starts at 10:00.

We will have a two-session Grand National Team club qualifying event on Saturday March 20. Starting time is 10:00. Bring a sandwich-we'll have soft drinks and chips. Event will be done about 5:30. There will be a one-session GNT event on Friday afternoon March 26 starting at 12:30-done about 4:15. We're going to try for a stand alone C-section.

Here's the best (my opinion) convention for use over opponents' opening 1NT:

A new variation on DON'T: Joyce and I use it in direct or pass out chair:

- 24- Clubs and a higher ranking suit
- 2 Diamonds and a higher ranking suit
- 2♥ Long Hearts (natural)
- 2♠ Long Spades (natural)

Double- shows either one long minor or both majors. If partner doubles, you are obligated to bid 2♣. If he has a minor, he will pass if it's clubs or correct if it's diamonds. If he has both majors instead, he will bid 2♥ over your 2♣ response and you then have to pass if Hearts is your better major or correct to 2♠. The advantages of this system over Capeletti and regular DONT are obvious: 1) it allows you to play 2 clubs. (Especially advantageous at equal or adverse vulnerability) 2) You can get a single, long suit major into the auction in one step with no interference or confusion. 3) you have a better handle on major/minor 2-suiters.

At the end of February the cup races have 3 months to run (May 31). So far we have 12 players with over 100 Master Points won at the club. The top 22 are on pace to go over 100 by them. Jay, Ellie and I are on track to go for 200. Last year we had 10 (a record) over 100 before we changed the format to all special sanction events. The increased attendance also pushes up the awards. The change in format also puts rating the Sol Lourie Open contestants on an equal footing. Before switching formats, some were playing a mix of regular and special events on perhaps 2 open games while others were mostly cherry picking only the special sanctions on all five open games. Again this month there's a shakeup atop the Open race.
