Contrary to some people's belief, directors are not just eagerly awaiting the chance to levy a procedural penalty on your game. Our job is to make sure everyone-not just you-has a good time. This DOES mean that we MUST enforce the conditions of contest. We want to see the issue of winning and losing settled by the bridge that's played-but if you're taking too much time-you're taking away from someone else's chances of winning to unfairly increase your own. And that isn't fun at all. No cell phones!! That comes directly from ACBL-that isn't just a local rule. Duplicate is a game of skill, not unfair deception (although there is legitimate deception allowed). This is why we have the requirement that conventional bids must be alerted-AND ALERTED IN A TIMELY MANNER. This means you pay attention and "alert" before the player on your right calls. Waiting for her to bid, then saying 'Alert' is not acceptable. Trying to peek at their bidding like that is like trying to peek at their hand. Mike Flader in the ACBL Bulletin this month has a good article on this. Law 16(b) (Unauthorized extraneous Information from partner): "... After a player makes available to his partner extraneous information that may suggest a call or play, as for example by a remark, a question, a reply to a question, an unexpected Alert or a failure to Alert...the partner may not choose from logical alternatives one that could demonstrably have been suggested over another by the extraneous information." The director is to redress this situation to provide equity. From my experience as a player, I can tell you that when this situation is inadequately addressed by a game director, it leaves a lot of very hard feelings. So stay Alert.

I previously made mention of the big club system played by Meckstroth/Rodwell with 137 pages of system notes. That 137 was a number I picked out of thin air-turns out the real number is "over 200 pages". (It varies as they refine the system) These notes have to be turned over to opposing teams before the matches in top national and international team events. And they still have the occasional partnership misunderstanding!! And sometimes the agreements force them into some bad spots (because bidding on would make it worse).
