Moving Up: Junior Master-Marcia Fletcher Bronze Life Master Happy Powell (Florence)

Have a bad game? If you have six bucks, you can play again tomorrow.

Since a gadget Joyce and I play came up so frequently at the tournament and worked so well against so many local players, I've been asked to explain our defense against weak two bids. First, we don't make vulnerable takeout or balancing doubles with bad 10-counts-in that way lies minus 200 and perdition. Overcalls are good suits and opening points, doubles are shapely and at least opening strength, no-trump overcalls are 16+ HCP and 1+ stopper in the overcalled suit. Cue bids ask partner to bid 3NT with a stopper-it is NOT Michaels of any stripe. This hand is typically a one-suiter (solid) with stoppers in the other two side suits. The two-suiters are handled with Leaping Michaels. If opponent opens 2\(\phi\) and you hold a 14 count hand that is 2-5-5-1 you don't want to double-partner always bids Clubs. What do you do if you overcall 3\(\pi\) and opener's partner calls 4\(\phi\)? You really want to bid 5\(\phi\) now if partner PASSED? (If you do-partner has an annoying habit of being 2-2-2-7) Do you really want to double 4 Spades if they have a double fit in the black suits? Well, a Leaping Michaels bid of 4\(\phi\) over the opening 2\(\phi\) call shows five of the other major plus this minor with a hand of good opening strength. You have told your partner your story and he is now well placed to pass, double the 3 or 4\(\phi\) advance or place your contract in the correct spot whether they further the pre-empt -or not.

Now that we have listed all the winners of the 2009/10 races, we're almost 3 months into the new cup races for 2010/11. These races will go through May 31 of 2011. So far, a lot of the usual suspects are riding high, though some have gotten out of the blocks a little slower than expected. The Saul Lourie Open looks to be the most exciting with maybe 8 serious contenders. Of course Jay came out of nowhere to win last year, so who knows? If Jay doesn't win the Saul Lourie, the Henry Mills 0-2000 looks to be his to lose. Past winner and perennial contender Arnold Levinson along with Abduhl Ghaffar would seem to be his main competition. In the Coleman Farrell Non Life-Master-Arnold, will you get serious about playing some Gold Point events and leave this contest to Zan Edmunds, Everett Ness and Bill Charlwood? Last years Centurion Cup winner Francis Robinson would also seem to have a shot. The Centurion Cup (0-100) is always a surprise-a pleasant one. No one knows what new player will find a handle on the game and emerge with this trophy. We have a lot of possibles.
