There is a proposal to change the requirement to vote from 10 games played in the previous year to no play requirement.

December 16 was the evening of the party-starting with social hour at 5:30 dinner at 6:00 and bridge 7:15-ish. Our Chair-people **Mary Ann Cross** and **Pat Blume** did just a wonderful job, didn't they? Thanks to Charlie and Dick behind the bar, Mike for directing three sections and Loren and Gene Alexander at the door.

### Congratulations/Moving Up New Bronze Life Master Zan Edmunds

The club will be closed December 24th through January 3<sup>rd</sup>. See you in Charleston for the Regional....and of course bright and early Tuesday the 4<sup>th</sup> at the club!

There will be no game Monday evening January 17.

Time to start getting your Teams together for the GNT. We have the long layoff over Christmas and the first event is early (Feb. 5<sup>th</sup>). Dode is going to be disappointed if we don't get 20 teams one of these times. Stratification is 0-500, 0-2000 and over 2000 for the player with the most master points on the team. Same as usual: bring a sandwich; the club will have chips, drinks and dessert. We'll start at 10:00, take a short lunch break and finish about 5:30.

The question from a couple different players, in one form or another, was why the procedural penalty on late plays and why am I so slow to pick up the boards for slow play and other directors are quicker? This perception isn't quite true-one recent Tuesday I picked up 4 boards on one round and nine in the game-including two pairs who had play curtailed on 2 boards each. Things have been running a lot smoother on Tuesdays since then. I like to see the issue of winning and losing settled by players at the table rather than by computer factoring. When an adjusted score is awarded on a board, there is no cold top or bottom. You can't say definitely that that adjusted score wouldn't have been one or the other; thus the factoring on the board. This leads to situations like the following: On the Monday STaC, Ken Fasching and I had a 67.48% (9.50 Silver) game to finish second to the McLaughlins 67.50% (12.67 Silver). There was a board with a "no play" where we got a 3.88 matchpoint score instead of a top of 4. The two pairs who were slow and the director who picked up the board cost us 1st place. I hate to see that happen, but sometimes it is unavoidable. Being constantly late is just rude (Law 74) to the rest of the field (especially on the last round) as well as distorting the conditions of contest for the event (unethical by the Laws of Duplicate Bridge #90). Procedural penalties make that clear.

From the Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge: Law 65 Part C) "Orderliness. Each player arranges his own cards in an orderly over-lapping row in the sequence played, so as to permit review of the play after its completion, if necessary, to determine the number of tricks won by each side or the order in which the cards were played." Part D) "Agreement on results of play. A player should not disturb the order of his played cards until agreement has been reached on the number of tricks won. A player who fails to comply with the provisions of this law jeopardizes his right to claim ownership of doubtful tricks or to claim a revoke."

Law 72 Part B section 4: "Concealing an infraction: A player may not attempt to conceal an inadvertent infraction, as by committing a second revoke, concealing a card involved in a revoke or mixing the cards prematurely."

(shuffling your cards without agreement on tricks won, not allowing a trick by trick examination, loses you the ruling if the director is called-that's open and shut)
