Congratulations/Moving Up NABC Master Carolyn Swartout

You don't see this every month-as a matter of fact this is the first in at least 12 years: Diamond Life Master (5000 Master points) **Joyce Hampton!!** (and she has a National Championship to go with it-the 6 session Women's Open Swiss Team.)

I've been asked if I could run those 58 things to remember about bridge-Took me about 30 installments the first time, but I guess there's always a new group coming up that needs to know. The answer is no I can't because I can't find a copy-I know there were a lot given out and I'd run another batch of copies if someone would lend me theirs. For now, four things-two on bidding and two on bridge philosophy that aren't on those pages:

1) The cornerstone of bidding is establishing trump in a 4-4 fit in a major suit. Four trumps in each hand produces an extra trick over a No-trump contract against the expected (68%) 3-2 break of the outstanding trumps in opponents hands. If your trump fit is 5-3, the advantage is not so great (unless you hold a singleton with the 3-card support) and you might want to try for an against-the-field matchpoint score in a NT contract. 2) Bidding 5 of a minor is almost always wrong. Aim for 3 No Trump without an 8-card major suit fit.. If you and your partner go past 3NT with big minor suits-you are aiming at slam-cue bid aces-see if you can get there. 3) Learn to recognize STOP signs. If your partner shows a six card suit, and you don't have any, or just one, it's usually best to let him play across from minimum values rather than digging a hole any deeper. (He doesn't have any better fit for you than you have for him-trust me) side observation-3 NT is where misfits go to usually die a messy, horrible death. Bidding your own suit more than twice is WRONG. You play the fits, let opponents play the misfits 4) If your hand has all hard values such as Axx, xx, Axxx, KQJx, and you have established no Major suit 8 card fit but game level assets-try to get your partner to bid 3 NT. This protects his soft values from attack on the opening lead: say he holds Qx, KQTx QTx Axxx, you'd really rather have the lead come to him rather than through him. That's called right-siding the contract and a lot of times the difference between making and going down. With the first hand, after partner opens 1 club, I respond 1 Diamond-he bids 1 Heart and I bid a fourth suit force 2 Spades. Players who can't wait to bid 3 NT instead of 2 Spades just irritate me no end. Get a Spade on the opening lead through the Q and you have 6 or 7 tricks if the King is over the Queen. With a Spade through the ace on opening lead you're about 90% to make 9 tricks.

Of course he plays the contract while you watch from dummy-but wouldn't you really rather win?
