"So," I've been asked. "what do you mean by bidding the partnership assets instead of just the 13 cards in front of you?' OK, here are a few examples: you hold ♠ 8 ♥ Q-10-8-4 ♦ K-J-6-4-2 ♠ A-7-3. The bidding:

LHO

Partner

RHO

You

1 Spade

Double

Pass

?

You have a really good hand with that stiff Spade-10 HCP-what do you do? The general guideline is jump with 5 cards and 8 or more HCP or 4 cards and 10 count. On this hand you **DO NOT** bid 3 Diamonds. Your partner has Hearts for his take-out double-he wants to hear about that 4-card Heart suit-not the diamonds! Bid 3 Hearts.

Here's a sequence I see butchered almost every time I play:

You 1 of a minor **LHO**1 of a major

Partner Pass

RHO Pass

?

Or another similar but more obvious situation:

You

LHO

Partner

RHO

1 of a major 2 something

Pass

Pass

Notice I haven't given you any hands. Wonder why? It's because with very few exceptions your bid is the same-double! Your partner has no penalty double available to him! He has to let you balance back in with a double and then he passes for penalty. What if he doesn't have the penalty hand to pass? If he doesn't have the penalty pass he bids a long suit of his own without a fit for yours or makes a minimum raise of your suit with at least a small doubleton. This is what you have to do when you play negative doubles. Oh-the exceptions: when you have a long (6+) SOLID suit or a very distributional 2-suiter, or hands where you hold the trump stack against over-caller (you know partner is busted and not holding a stack)
