If you want to play N/S, get there early to claim your spot. This is why I like to play E/W-you're never in a less than desirable spot for more than 2-3 boards.

While we're on the subject of playing conditions: The directors run the games, they are not your maids. When the game is over, you are supposed to clean up your own table. Put the bidding boxes back in the tub, also the drink trays. Bring the boards and table cards to the director's desk. Then throw away all your trash accumulated through the round-cups, papers plates and wrappers. The Center only sets up and breaks down our tables-we are responsible for clean-up!

No games at the club or TriCity during the tournament August 4-7. See you at Dent. Flyers for the tournament are available at the director's desk every club game. Special notice: There is an IMP pair game on Thursday night-I like this because there isn't a big penalty for missing an overtrick; the important part is getting to the contract and then making it! There is a compact KO team event starting Friday morning and concluding Friday afternoon (four 12 board matches if you make it to the finals). The regular KO teams start Friday evening and finish up on Saturday. There are Stratified pair games and 299 games all day Friday and Saturday. Sunday of course is Open and 299'er Swiss team.

So, you don't want to expand your bridge system or put any work into your game. Hmmm. Consider your clothes closet. One long bar with a bunch of wire hangers. Like point count bidding. That's the basics-but all it does is get you started. How about two bars-high and low; wouldn't you like some tiered hangers you could hang half a dozen shirts in the space formerly used by just one? How about tiered hangers with clips for half a dozen pairs of pants and a coat over the top? Tired of looking for two shoes that match out of the 75 on the floor? And where is #76 anyway? How about a tie rack instead of just using a hanger to flop them all over-and watching them spill onto the floor most days when you pull one off? Padded hangers? Slotted? Those closet improvements take time and effort-but most people will agree they are very worth-while. So read the bridge magazines-and the daily bridge columns in the paper. Come early to the game and talk it over with your partner. Conversation with my partner: "I like to play with you because you know when to pass. How are you missing these today?" Me: "Well the converse is that I know when to bid and double instead of pass. You bid a four card suit where I expected only five (or more) and another you bid a King, two Queens and a Jack like a well structured 10+. How am I supposed to judge well in those situations? Like the computer guys say-garbage in=garbage out." A player has to think about what his partner is going to think he has before he makes a call. Your partner has to trust your bids-opponents don't-and won't. It's much easier and more destructive to fool partner.
