Schedule change: because of the party, there will be no afternoon game on June 28. The Friday, June 15 game will have an early start. Game time is 10:00 Welcome to Margaret White-Life Master moved here now at 803-465-0262

This month, a little about "attitude": Bridge is a partnership game. You have assets or knowledge that your partner needs to know about. Bridge has to be played as a partnership game or you are at a severe disadvantage. It's a bidder's game, but you do best if you look for ways to help your partner make decisions than if you go the "Hero" route and try to win by yourself. This confuses partner and leads to mistakes. Further, partner is not an idiot and they're on your side (really). It is better to be deceived by our partners than to mistrust them. (You'll score better) To this end-stay with your system! Don't bid a four card suit when pard will look for five or skip over a 4-card suit to bid NT first-then try to blame them for playing the wrong contract or on the wrong side or both. Know also that in a competitive auction, partner will frequently go wrong at the 3-level holding K-10 tight in your suit if you've tried to be the Lone Ranger. Don't open 1NT with a singleton-and then try to get out of playing a 5-1 fit on a transfer sequence. On defense-have a carding agreement-this is the biggest partnership aspect of the game and you can't be playing by yourself. Imperative- think about what the hand looks like from partner's point of view. Don't overcall at the two level with a Q-x-x-x-x suit that is likely to draw doubles in the auction or the wrong lead from partner on defense. Last-be willing to work on your game.

II've been asked for a few explanations, so here goes: The cup races are year-long events. They run from June 1 to May 31-trophies awarded at the summer party in June. The race for all the players (Unlimited number of master points) is the Sol Lourie. The next race for all players with less than 2000 master points is the Henry Mills. The third race is for all players that started the club year (last June 1st) as Non-Life Masters-the Coleman Farrell race. The last trophy is the Centurion Cup for players who last June 1st had less than 100 Master points. Some people claim these are 'attendance awards'. Maybe-but you still have to win when you play to make a run at the trophy. You can look at these running results on-line at the CBC web page along with the attendance numbers. It's interesting to divide the number of points won by the number of times played. The bigger the number, the better it is of course. There are also the Robert McMahon trophies which parallel the categories of the point awards. These results are done by Mike Bitonti at the end of the club year. These awards are for the players with the highest average percentage scores of all the games they played at the club. We only show the top five and these are your toughest competition, obviously. You need 36 Open games for the top two McMahon and 24 Limited games (0-100,0-200, 0-1000, 0-1500) for the next two. Only games played at the club count for all of these awards!! No tournament points are counted.
