If you are leading against a slam, you might try to find some other passive lead if you don't have a strong sequence to lead from.

The Board has voted to start a Sunday game. The first play date for the CBC Sunday game is May 5 at 1:30. When polled, 60 members indicated an interest in a CBC Sunday game. See you there!!

Columbia Bridge Club will hold mini classes on individual subjects and conventions. (The dialogue is from "Live Free or Die Hard-great action flick by the way) A lot of new bridge partnerships decide what to play about the same way. "Play 2 over 1 with inverted minors, Bergan, Drury, Roman Key and weak twos?" "Sure" You should really invest a little more time in discussion. Is five to the Jack for support and two outside aces really a weak hand? You might (or might not) surprise your partner tabling this dummy as a weak jump raise. Is a new suit over partner's weak two opener forcing? (or not? Surprise!!) What are your bids over opponents' interference with your 1NT opener? What is your asking bid over partner's weak two? (feature, shortness? Ogust? Other?) What is your NT bid over their weak two showing? Those pairs who spend a little time before the game and a little more time after the game talking over these kinds of questions do a lot better than those that don't.
