Advice I read in 'Bridge World' from a world champion that is almost a duplicate of that given me lo these many years ago by Betty Voldseth and Dixie Hastings who tried to show me the difference between bridge and duplicate. "There is luck, but a minimum. There is art as well as science. Don't get tangled up in the science. Get in quick on prime cards (aces and kings) or long suits. Get out quick if partner doesn't show anything. Raise on pure values (Aces and well supported honors). Trust your partner. Be trustworthy." It's the only way to play and be consistently successful. True today as it was then.

Just a few things on Sectionals: 1) Play on Friday (or Thursdays also if they have games) and any evening Zip Swiss. The people you don't want to face are either in KO's or won't be there till Saturday and mostly just for main events 2) Be aware that what works in a point-limit game does not work in Open competition. You need experience in the Open section before you can be successful. Your first few sessions are going to be rough-they will be smoother sooner if you learn from them. 3) Don't take any crap from the 'A'' players and certainly not from the B's (which, frankly, is a lot more likely) That's one of the reasons a director is there.
