Thinking on defense: Joyce and I had a hand in the Aiken Swiss team where a big swing was at stake. Opponents were in the wrong contract and our defense had to come through. I'll give you my hand, the dummy and the bidding and let's see how you do:

I led the Club 10 to dummy's Jack, Joyce's Queen and Declarer's Ace. Back came a low Spade to the Ace and three rounds of Diamonds-Declarer being void from the start. She now led the fourth round of Diamonds to my Jack with Joyce pitching the 3 of Spades. What do you lead and why? Answer later.

Check out your rating on the Common Game site? Interesting-tells where you need to improve as well as where you're strong. Take mine-for a couple of games my partnerships were scoring 70% on the boards where I was declarer (Backed off some now, but nice while it lasted). When my partner declared, we were at 54% (I didn't find him a good spot or he didn't) When on defense and my partner on lead we were at 59%-great for defense-but we were only 46% when I was on opening lead-no surprise-it's why I play West or North a lot.

So what did you lead? Partner knows I'm not leading a Spade-that gives declarer 9 tricks. She can't signal with a high club-she needs it to beat the contract. She had J-9-8 of Hearts- she doesn't want to encourage a Heart lead. I lead the 8 of Clubs and the rest is history. If she had the Ace of Hearts instead of an original K-Q-9-x-x of clubs, she would encourage a Heart lead and see if I lead a low Heart showing Heart cards or a high spot indicating no Heart values and that she should switch back to clubs through declarer as I held the club tenace.
