How to Handle a Revoke at Your Table

When someone fails to follow suit when they should have, that is called a revoke. What should you do when someone at your table revokes? Here is how to handle the situation.

First of all, if you or your partner revokes and you catch it before either of you has played to the next trick, it can be corrected. If that happens, call the director immediately. Do not take any action and do not let another person at the table tell you what you have to do. Call the director!

Once you or your partner has played to the next trick, it is too late to correct the revoke. In that case, once you realized you or your partner has revoked, DO

The Eight is Enough Potluck Supper game has been NOT SAY ANYTHING. Do not call the director. Just continue playing. It is up to the opponents to catch the revoke themselves.

But what if the revoke occurred by an opponent and you catch it? Then you still should not say anything. Continue playing until the hand is over. But as soon as the last card is turned, you should immediately say, "Don't mix your cards together. I need to call the director." They, of course, are going to want to know why you are calling the director, but you are best off not saying anything until the director gets there.

When the director gets there, say something like, "I think there was a revoke by my left hand opponent" and tell approximately which trick where you think the revoke.

THIS IS IMPORTANT: Do not turn any cards over unless the director tells you too. If any of the players at the table start turning cards over, it is very likely that the cards will be mixed up and it will be difficult or impossible to determine whether a revoke occurred (That is why you don't say why you are calling the director).

Listen to the director and do as he or she says. Turn cards over only if he tells you to and turn only those cards over that he tells you to.

If the director does determine if a revoke occurred, he is going to ask you a series of questions: Did you win the trick on which the revoke occurred? Did you win any tricks after the revoke? Just answer the questions he asked. Do not give any extra information. Don't tell why you revoked or make excuses. That just delays the process and requires the director to restate the questions. Then the director will tell you what the trick adjustment will

If you feel that the trick adjustment is not sufficient and that you would have won more tricks if the opponent had not revoked, then you are entitled to point that out. You do not have to do that right away. You can take your time and think about it and let the director know so he or she can investigate.
