## Western League Report 2021/22

This is the second year that all the matches have been played online. The format has been refined as we have gone along and now runs pretty smoothly. Matches are played over 7 Saturdays from September to May, with 24 boards played in two stanzas of 12.

In respect of results for this year.

I understand that at least one of the Counties is reluctant to return to face to face bridge in light of the low numbers of people available for selection and difficulties in getting them to travel the distances to play matches. That said, I know many do like playing face to face and are looking for this to return, so we may end up with a hybrid system.
