### Minutes of the 50th Annual General Meeting held on Saturday, 17th May 1997 at Brentwood Preparatory School.

#### 1. Hon. Chairman's Opening Remarks

Mr. Richard Green opened the meeting by welcoming in particular Mr. and Mrs. Grant, Mr. Stocken and Mrs. Schram, a founder member of the Association, to the 50th Annual General Meeting. He said he was sorry to have to mention the sad deaths of Simon Suess and Max Wolfe, but both had given so much to the Association, as Committee members and teachers.

#### 2. Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting

These had been circulated and were taken as read. They were agreed to be a correct record and their adoption was proposed by Mrs. Lovett and seconded by Mrs. Hartley. Mr. Green signed the minutes.

#### 3. Matters arising

There were no matters arising.

#### 4. Report by Hon. General Secretary

This is attached in full. Its adoption was proposed by Mr. Grant and seconded by Mr. Garcia. Mr. Green thanked Mrs. Curtis for her work on behalf of the Association, not only for the past year, but for the past 40 years. He read the postscript, written by our President, Mr. Grant, to the Short History of the Essex C.B.A. in the recent Newsletter. Mr. Grant presented Mrs. Curtis with a gift to commemorate these years, for which she thanked the Association.



## 5. Hon. Tournament Secretary's Report

This is attached. Mrs. Schram proposed its adoption, seconded by Mr. R. Rose and this was passed by the meeting. Mr. Green thanked Mr. Prince for his unflagging enthusiasm, and his objective, constructive approach.

## 6. Report by the Hon. Treasurer

Unfortunately, Mr. Philpott was unable to be present, and his report was read by the Hon. Chairman. There were no questions, and the adoption of the report was proposed by Lady Telford, seconded by Mr. L. Burr and passed by the meeting. Mr. Green said how much the county owed to Mr. Philpott, and that he had now completed 23 years as Treasurer. He said the county had bought him a small gift, which he would give him at an appropriate time. Mr. Green also thanked the auditor, Mr. Jerry Owen, and proposed his re-appointment. This was passed unanimously by the meeting.

## 7. Report by the Hon. League Secretary

Mr. Valtisaris had circulated his report to all members present, and this is attached. The adoption of his report was proposed by Mrs. L. Barker, seconded by Mr. R. Perryman and passed by the members present. Mr. Green thanked Mr. Valtisaris for all the work involved in coping with 73 teams - harrying, chasing, etc.

## 8. Subscription 1998/99

The committee proposed that there should be no change in the Essex portion for the year starting 1st April 1998. This was agreed unanimously.

## 9. Election of Officers and Committee

All the Officers and Committee members were willing to continue, and no nominations had been received. All were declared re-elected. Mr. Green thanked all the Committee members whom he had not mentioned previously. He said that they represented all parts of the county.

## 10. Any Other Business

(a) Mrs. C. Brown asked if the World Championship cards could be withdrawn, as they affected her eyesight - and possibly other peoples. Mrs. Curtis said there were very few left in the boards, and she would check each set.

(b) Mrs. S. French suggested that clubs should raise the question of lack of interest in competitions at their AGMs, and find out what members want. It was suggested that a questionnaire might be sent to all members, but Mr. Valtisaris said that judging from the one he sent, few would reply. Mr. Prince said that it would be better to ask non-regular competitors.

Mr. Green said that he would take the opportunity of speaking to other counties and exchange ideas.

Mrs. Burr mentioned that there were few young players entering competitions.

There being no further formal matters the meeting closed with a vote of thanks to the Chairman. Following this Mr. Green drew attention to the Good Friend of Essex Bridge Award, that was being presented posthumously to Simon Suss. He said that it would be given to his parents.

Mrs. Grant presented the prizes and trophies, and she, Mrs. Margaret Green and Mrs. Maureen White were presented with flowers.

The draws for the Teams of Four and Switch Cup were made by the members present. The meeting was followed by a Wine and Cheese party and a social teams of four.

## HON SECRETARY'S REPORT

Just over 50 years ago the Essex C.B.A. was founded by a small group of enthusiastic bridge players. The first major step was the foundation of a Duplicate Section playing at The Eagle, Snarebrook. My parents were keen to join, and on the first night my father went along to register. The hall was full - about 120 people were there. There was little

organised leisure activity in 1947, and this was the start of the opportunity to take part in competitive bridge. The hall at the Eagle had been damaged during the war, and not yet repaired. My mother often spoke of the poor conditions, and the cold in winter. Everyone wore coats and boots, and many took rugs to put over the knees. She was amused when I spoke of today's expectations of 5-star hotels at 1-star costs! From that small group, the Association has grown to 1,181, slightly up on last year. Many are new members, some joining through the new E.B.U. membership scheme. We hope that they will keep their membership and will take part in the many and varied competitions open to them. As in every year, we lost members through many reasons, but we remember in particular Simon Suss, who put so much into Essex bridge by his work for the Committee and in local teaching, and Max Wolfe who died 10 days ago. As I reported in my short history of Essex bridge, the Duplicate Sections were set up by the Association, and were extremely popular. It was a long time before outside clubs were started, and affiliated to the county, except May & Baker which celebrated its 50th anniversary two years ago. Now there are 60 affiliated clubs, many catering for the vast number of players coming through from classes. There is still one Duplicate Section now playing at yet another venue. However, it has found a satisfactory home at last, and is on the lines of the first section started all those years ago.

As far as competitions are concerned, the Association now offers many different formats - many more than 50 years ago. But comparing numbers, our entries have not grown in relation to the membership. Many of our clubs now hold competitions and there are many open Swiss teams in the county, which attract large numbers. Whilst this is excellent for bridge generally, it does mean that the Committee has to consider whether to re-organise the competition calendar and reluctantly drop some competitions. Personally, I think this would be a great shame. Sid Prince will report on the competitions and results, and I think we should be grateful to him for giving up so much of his time to direct and send out all the results. I believe that we are one of the few counties which send results to everyone who takes part - not just to clubs - and enclose the local points.

The inter-county competitions have increased over the 50 years, especially with the formation of the Eastern Counties League. Now over 100 players each year have the opportunity of representing their county, so that those who do well in competitions have something additional to aim for. The highlight of the year was Essex qualifying for the Final of the Tollermahe Cup. However, last summer the Metropolitan Cup results were poor, but Essex did much better in the Eastern Counties League. The A team was 4th, 10 points behind the winners; the B team was 3rd, 9 points behind, and the C team was joint 3rd, only 2 points behind the winners. Thanks must go to Sid Prince, Roger Tattersfield and Audrey Hartley for another year of hard work, making sure that we actually have 8 players for each team for each match - not always an easy task with the amount of bridge on offer for players. Special thanks must go to Giffed and Jill Day for organising and providing the teams with refreshments - again a far from easy task.

On the national front, once again our congratulations go to Beryl Kerr and Roberta Trayman, who were selected to play for Great Britain in the Olympiad in Rhodes last October, and to Akram Zaman, who played for Wales in one of the Camrose matches; also Albert and Carol Brown, who took part in the friendly match against Eire, representing the club members. In addition, of course, there were many Essex members who distinguished themselves in national competitions and congresses across the country. Just think - if all these players can do well, so can many more. Come out from the clubs and enter county and national competitions. Put your toe in the water, and find out how enjoyable it is. In his League Report, Denis Valtisaris also emphasises how easy it is to do this - just make up a team of four and have the pleasure of five or six matches in your own homes.

An Essex congress was discussed in the early years of the Association, but discarded due to many reasons, and it was not until the Frinton B.C. decided to run one in aid of the European Championships in 1975 that we were fortunate to have a Congress. It is due to members from that club and that area of Essex, that we still have the Clacton



Congress today. Numbers were down again this year - unfortunately due to the continual necessary change of date and definitely not due to the splendid organisation led by Claude Stokes over all these years. We were very sorry to learn that, because of ill-health, Claude will not be continuing as Secretary. It is difficult to imagine a Congress without him - he is part of the fabric of the Congress. We wish him many happy years of retirement, and hope to see him at the Congress each year.

For the past year we have been unable to make headway with a Schools or Youth programme. Unfortunately, we were unable to replace Simon Sues. However, there is hope for the future - Paul Spencer has said that he has some spare time, and we are delighted that he has offered to undertake this task. He is going to attend the special EBU County Youth Officers Training Weekend in June, and will be looking for help throughout the county to introduce bridge into schools. Any past or present teacher who is interested should contact Paul and see what is required - mostly time and enthusiasm! Your Committee met four times as usual over the year to play the competition programme and all matters related to the running of the county. The new membership scheme eventually started in December. It is difficult to assess this new initiative until at least 12 months after its inception, as many members have joined in the early part of the year, rather than waiting until 1st April, as previously. Another very large initiative is the Bridge for All scheme, based on the teaching side of bridge, which should increase membership in the future. There is a very big financial commitment by the E.B.U., and Essex is supporting the scheme through a careful watch will be kept as it progresses.

It is of special interest to Ann Owen, our Teachers' Liaison Officer, who works very hard to try and ensure that all classes that require a teacher get a well qualified one. She reports that while there are many excellent teachers in Essex, there is still a shortage, and only two more teachers - Geoffrey Mann and Bernard Hammond - gained their professional qualification. Congratulations to them both. Only three teachers attended the Teachers' Association jamboree last summer, and it is hoped that many more will take the opportunity of going this summer. Ann hopes that there will be a workshop in Essex this coming autumn to help new teachers, and obviously would suggest that inexperienced and new teachers take that opportunity to attend. Our thanks go to Ann Owen and her helpers, who ran another Novices event last month. 53 pairs took their first steps to try out a more competitive event than their local club. Above all, the Association thanks Ann for all she does in this area of bridge.

Your three delegates, Gerard Faulkner, Sid Prince and myself have regularly attended Council Meetings, and reported to the Committee on the relevant issues. Last July the E.B.U. held the first weekend Conference which was well attended by delegates and a few onlookers. Certain matters were highlighted and spirited discussions took place. In most cases, these have been acted on by the various Committee or Council. This Conference looks to be ongoing, and this year it will take place in July in Warwick. Amongst the matters to be debated this year are the new laws, new licensing arrangements, Bridge for All and English Bridge. Once again Essex is prepared to fund one person, as an onlooker, and anyone interested should speak to Dick Green. At the Annual General Meeting last October, I was re-elected to the Board, and Gerard Faulkner, Cecil Leighton and I to the E.B.U. Tournament Committee, Gerard once again being re-elected Chairman. Gerard and I are also on the B.B.L. Tournament Committee.

Our hoped-for Dinner/Dance did not materialise - unfortunately the social side of bridge not being as high on people's agendas as in past years, but a small dinner attended by the E.B.U. Chairman, Peter Stocken, was very enjoyable. We hope that the Quiz Night planned for September will be more popular.

The Association only continues by enthusiasm and hard work of the County Committee and the Secretaries and Committees of the many affiliated Clubs. We can only hope that those who follow in our footsteps will continue the good work put in by all those members over the past 50 years.



## TOURNAMENT SECRETARY'S REPORT

I am pleased to say that the County Teams of Four, the Plate, and the Switch Cup knock-out competitions have been completed, and my thanks to all team captains for organising their matches on time.

The decline in the number of entries for many of the County events continues to cause concern to your committee, although our County is not alone in this regard. On the plus side, the Seniors were 35 pairs - half as many again as the previous 3 years. The Swiss Pairs, although only 40 took part, 8 pairs had to cancel through illness. The Switch Cup, G. C. Swiss, National Pairs, Hair & Son Swiss Teams, and Helliar were the same as for the previous 3 years. The Mixed Pairs were down by about 7 pairs, and all of the following competitions produced their lowest ever entries: Essex Pairs 52, Gwen Herga Ladies 20, Men 16, A. K. Trophy 23 teams, the Essex One Day Congress 14 teams, Mixed Teams 16, Ladies' Teams 9, and the Men's Teams 8. For this coming season the number of teams entered for the Essex Teams of Four is 16 - the lowest ever.

A small sub-committee has been set up to try to tackle this problem of dwindling entries, and any comments, criticisms, or suggestions from members would be very welcome.

As usual, I had some welcome assistance during the season from Bud Abbott, Mike Case, Audrey Hartley and Margaret Curtis, and I take this opportunity to thank them all.
