Minutes of the 53rd Annual General Meeting held on Sunday 14th May 2000  
at Hedley Walter High School, Brentwood, Essex.

### 1. Opening remarks by the Hon. Chairman.

Mr. Green welcomed everyone present, especially the Hon. President Mr. Mac Grant and his wife Barbara. He stated that Mr. Grant had done great service to the county and a cup in his honour from the now defunct Clacton Congress had been donated to the E.B.U. for the new Veterans and Seniors Congress at Eastbourne. He said that changes are inevitable and that after forty years membership in Essex and considerable years on the Committee as an E.B.U. delegate, Gerard Faulkner had resigned. He has moved to North Suffolk. Mr. Green reported that Mr. Faulkner had also acted as our legal adviser and he was still willing to undertake this task. He was thanked in his absence for all he had done, and he will be presented at a suitable time with the Good Friend of Essex Award. Mr. Green then commented on the Committee changes over the past year and said that they had made a considerable impact.

## HON. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 53rd year of the Association has now past and we are well into another century. The aim of our founding members was to boost duplicate bridge in Essex with clubs, competitions and matches, but I am sure that they could not have envisaged the way in which the game has now developed.

More and more bridge is played on the internet and the world has shrunk. Many counties have their own web site and Essex too is looking into this possibility.

Over the past year we have welcomed 90 new members and a further 57 through the Bridge for All scheme. We hope that all these players will soon be taking part in the county competitions. Our total membership stands at 1230 and our club membership is 56. This is down on last year as unfortunately some clubs are losing membership and having to amalgamate with other local clubs. In others, members are not interested in competitive bridge outside the club itself and see no point in affiliation.

Over the past year Essex players have definitely made their mark on the national scene. These have all been highlighted in our Newsletter, but I would like to draw attention to the major winners - Bernie Harrison and Dave Duffy, winners of the Great Northern Swiss Pairs; Paul Spencer and Marc Chawner, winners of the Swiss Teams Championship at the Brighton Summer Congress; Mark and Richard Rose, winners of the Championship Pairs at the Middlesex Congress and Gerard Faulkner, Pat Watson, Peter Clark, Stuart Nelson and David Baker - all congress winners.

We were delighted also to see that Nigel Cundy captained the Oxford University team in the annual varsity match and that Tim Prior also represented the University. The Oxford University team has just won the Portland Bowl, with Nigel as captain and will represent the Universities in the World Teams Championships. Many congratulations.

On the county side, the teams have had a mixed season. In the Metropolitan Cup neither team did particularly well. This competition was at one time a premier event, but it seems to have lost its popularity with some counties not taking part and others fielding weakened teams. Your Committee has considered withdrawing from this Cup and the organising secretary has expressed his doubts about the continuation.

This year the Tollemache team did not shine - so did not qualify for the final. However, the Eastern Counties League proved a happier hunting ground for the A team, winning it on a split tie, and the C team also did well, finishing 2nd.

For the year 2000/2001 it is certain that a small allocation of Green Points will be awarded to winning Eastern Counties players, and maybe in the Metropolitan Cup as well. Thanks are extended to the three Eastern Counties captains - Sid Prince, Audrey Hartley and Brian Robinson, and also to Jill Tattersfield, who organises the home refreshments.

As far as competitions are concerned, our new Hon. Tournament Secretary will give you a detailed picture, but overall it has been a mixed season - good numbers for some competitions, poor for others. Several new halls have been used this year and these have proved successful. Details of three more have been given to me, and thanks are due to everyone who helps in this way.

This summer we are running two joint County/E.B.U. Green-pointed events, one with Hertfordshire, and we do hope that as many members as possible will support them. Whilst they provide top level competitions within easy reach of members, they are the main way of raising money to fund the county.

We have been most grateful for the very generous sponsorship by Tiffin Green over the past 3 years, enabling the county to increase prizes for both the Tony Kelvin Trophy and Fletcher Cup. This year we have sponsorship from our printers, Helliar & Sons Ltd., and Lionel Warnick for our club posters. Many thanks to both.

Our new Hon. League Secretary will give you the results of the League, but I would like to say how much we appreciate the time and effort put in by Roger and Jill Tattersfield. They have had more time to chase teams to enter, and to get the Novices Divisions up and running.

As Teacher's Liaison, Ann Owen has continued to try and fill the vacant teaching posts that always seem to come up each year. Although quite a few teachers showed interest in the Bridge for All scheme, only six taught this year. Unfortunately some local Education Authorities are not keen for classes to have the extra cost involved. The Novices event that Ann Owen organises was slightly changed this year into two sections, separating the real beginners from those with a little more bridge knowledge. Forty-eight pairs took part, and thanks are due to Ann and her helpers.

In her report to the Committee, Ann ends with a plea for more people to take up teaching. She herself says she finds it pleasant and rewarding and is sure that more people might like to try, especially as the Bridge for All scheme makes it that much easier to start.

Despite several new contacts, Paul Spencer has been unable to make much headway with schools. Their seemed to be an interesting development in Redbridge with a planned demonstration by the E.B.U. of mini-bridge to three local boroughs, but this fell through - only one school was interested. Anyone with any entry to a school should contact Paul.

We were able to enter an Under-25 team in an inter-county tournament, but unfortunately this was very poorly supported. Last summer Essex supported 6 young players to go to the Loughborough Training Weekend, and they all enjoyed this.

Your three delegates to the E.B.U. Council - Gerard Faulkner, Sid Prince and I have regularly attended the meetings, including a Council Conference last July. This was not a great success - a poor Agenda, and little worthwhile discussion. Consequently, it has been decided not to hold one this year, and the county secretary's meeting has been re-instated in its place. It is hoped that this will enable views to be exchanged between counties on matters which concern us all. In October, new officers of the Union were elected, and the Hon. Chairman, David Harris, has stated that one of his aims is that all bridge players should be members of the Union. Your Committee does not agree with this - envisaging many clubs not affiliating if this should happen - and will speak strongly against such a proposal, should it be made. In addition, recommendations have recently been put forward for a radical change to the Union.



Your Committee has already debated these suggestions put forward by the Business Effectiveness Study Group (appointed by the Board) and broadly speaking it is not in favour of most of the changes put forward. Of particular concern is the abolition of the Tournament Committee - your county committee feels that this Committee is important for discussion and planning of competitions. Also the reduction of Council Meetings from 4 to 2 would not allow full county involvement. A major development has been the disbandment of the B.B.L. - much earlier than was envisaged in the first part of last year. Now the Home Unions are on their own and the E.B.U. will participate in European and World events under its own flag. Once again, Gerard Faulkner and I were elected to the Board and Tournament Committee, Gerard to the Selection Committee as well, and Paul Spencer to the Tournament Committee and Laws & Ethics Committee.

I mentioned earlier in my report the importance of support for the county. This related to county competitions, but it must start in the clubs themselves. There have been hundreds of pupils in bridge classes over the year, and several clubs have been set up, but few of these pupils have joined mainstream clubs and started playing in competitions. I do appeal to clubs of all sizes and standards to encourage newcomers to the game and make them feel welcome. In this way our county will grow and strengthen, our competitions will flourish and we will be able to put in place once again those events which unfortunately we have had to withdraw from the calendar, and even create new competitions.

# **SOUTH EAST & WEST ESSEX 1999/2000 LEAGUE REPORT**

Our first season as League Secretaries has now finished and we would like to thank you all for making it so enjoyable.

Some 350 members played in the League this year with 40 teams in the South East and 30 in the West. This shows a small increase for the second year running and there was only one withdrawal and three matches unplayed. These are low figures compared to recent years, but they are disappointing since each unplayed match is likely to have an impact on promotion or relegation and to affect teams other than those directly involved.

A Novices Division was introduced in the South East this year and was generally well received although differences in experience did cause some problems. Next season, if possible, we would like to separate the Novices into those who have perhaps played only for a couple of years and are probably still at classes, and more experienced players (but still below the rank of District Master) who have played at clubs, but have not played a great deal of competitive duplicate bridge.
