**Minutes of the 55th Annual General Meeting held on Sunday 12th May 2002 at
Hedley Walter High School, Brentwood, Essex.**

1. Hon. Chairman's Opening remarks.

Mr. Green welcomed those present. He said that Mr. and Mrs. Grant were unable to attend this year, due to Mr. Grant's poor health. Mr. Grant had written and spoken to Mrs. Curtis and Mr. Green. He still takes a close interest in the county's affairs. He had hoped to continue to be an active President, but had not been able to do so recently. Mr. Green said that both Vice-Presidents, Mrs. Teddy Schram and Mrs. Tricia Fletcher were unable to come to the meeting.

Mr. Green drew attention to the resignation after the publication of the Agenda of Mrs. Audrey Hartley as Hon. Tournament Secretary. He said that a difference of opinion could not be resolved, and she felt that she had no alternative but to resign. Mr. Green thanked Mrs. Hartley for her extremely hard work and zest in her short term of office, both from the competitors and the Committee.

2. Minutes of the 2001 Annual General Meeting.

These had been circulated to all members, and were taken as read. They were agreed to be a correct record, and their adoption was proposed by Mr. Eric Field, seconded by Mrs. Jill Tattersfield and passed by the meeting.

3. Matters arising.

There were no matters arising.

4. Hon. Secretary's Report.

This is attached in full. Mr. Alan Green questioned the clash of the Essex Pairs with other events, especially the Norfolk Congress. Mrs. Curtis said that clashes were unavoidable (see under Competitions Report) the calendar is almost impossible to arrange, and if anyone else would like to arrange it they would be welcome! The adoption of the report was proposed by Mrs. Coldham and seconded by Mrs. Lovett, and passed by the meeting.

Mr. Richard Green thanked Mrs. Curtis for her hard work, and commented on the many aspects of bridge administration that she was involved in.

5. Hon. Tournament Secretary's Report.

Mrs. Curtis gave a short Competition Report in place of a Tournament Secretary's Report. This is attached in full.

Mrs. Taylor drew attention again to her problem in taking part in various club events, as her own club did not always take part, or organise teams. It was agreed that any club holding heats of county competitions, or simultaneous pairs might advertise on the web-site if they were able to take visitors.

National Newcomers' - Semi-Final. A comment was made about the cost of the Regional Final. Mrs. Curtis said that E.B.U. events were a lot more expensive than county events, due to higher costs - hall charge, national tournament directors, profit expectation, etc.

The report's adoption was proposed by Mrs. Sheril, seconded by Mrs. Tattersfield and passed by the meeting.

6. Hon. Treasurer's Report.

Due to Mr. Philpot's absence on holiday, Mr. Green presented the accounts, attached in full. Mr. Green drew attention to the points set out by Mr. Philpot.

Attention was drawn to the payment in advance of the hire of Walthamstow Assembly Hall for our One-Day event in June 2003; this will save us money in the long run. Several expenses were much lower than in 2001 - printing and stationery, engraving of trophies, web-site set up.

Thanks were extended to John Cordingley, the new Auditor, who is happy to stand for another year.

Mr. Philpot had stated that the Essex portion of the subscription had not risen for the past 3 years, and he proposed, on agreement with the Committee, that it should not go up in the year 2003/4.

Mrs. Curtis said that the E.B.U. portion is likely to rise by 50p making a total subscription of £19,00p for individuals and £22,50p for clubs.

The adoption of the accounts was proposed by Mr. O'Gara, seconded by Mr. Prince, and passed by the meeting.

Mr. Green, as Hon. Chairman, proposed that we accept Mr. Cordingley's willingness to continue as Hon. Auditor, and this was agreed unanimously.

7. Report by the Hon. League Secretary.

This is attached in full.

The adoption of the report was proposed by Mr. Field, seconded by Mrs. Wells and agreed by the meeting.

Mr. Green thanked both Dr. Tattersfield and Mrs. Tattersfield for all the work they had done on the League.

8. Subscription 2003/2004

This had been dealt with under the Hon. Treasurer's Report.

9. Election of Officers and Committee for 2002/2003.

No proposals had been received for the Officers and members of Committee. All were automatically re-elected.

Due to the resignation of Mrs. Hartley there is a vacant position - that of Hon. Tournament Secretary. Mr. Green said that the Committee would be seeking to fill that position as soon as possible.

Mr. Green took the opportunity of thanking all those members of Committee, who had not given reports, but nevertheless attended meetings and helped at the competitions - Mrs. Tattersfield (webmaster), Mr. Valtisaris, Mr. Field, Mr. Prince, Mr. Spencer, Lady Telford, Mr. Cundy and Mrs. Hair.

10. Any Other Business.

(a) Appeal procedure - Mr. Megahay said that the Appeal procedure for results of competitions is not clear and not stated anywhere in Essex literature. Mrs. Curtis said that we follow the E.B.U. regulations, but it has not been necessary previously. It was agreed it should be put up at competitions, and also on the web-site.

(b) New Competition - Mr. Alan Green suggested a new competition - knock-out teams of those in the League. It was agreed to find out from the League teams if there would be sufficient interest to run such a competition. Mrs. Curtis said that not all the 1st Division teams are interested in the Summer Knock-Out - mostly due to the travel involved.

There being no further business the meeting closed with a vote of thanks to the Chairman.

The draw for the County Teams of Four and Switch Cup did not take place, as the closing date had been extended to the end of May.

Mrs. Margaret Green presented the prizes and trophies and she and Maureen White were presented with flowers. Thanks were extended to both ladies and Dave White for preparing the Wine and Cheese Party which followed.

The meeting finally closed with a social pairs event.

HON. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Faster and faster go the days and months - already another year has passed since our last Annual General Meeting. And what has happened to our Association during that time? There are many positive things to report but perhaps the least impressive in the slight reduction in our membership, and within that membership few new competition players. At the end of March our membership stood at 1150 made up of 1048 renewals, 47 new members from clubs and 45 Bridge for All members. Our club affiliations stood at 55.

The first positive thing to report is the successes gained by many members in national competitions and congresses. These are all reported in the News Sheet and on the Essex web-site, but I would like to mention the continued success of Nigel Cundy and Tim Prior, representing Oxford University, winning the Portland Bowl for the third year running.

We should also like to congratulate Yvonne Dagwell, who received the Dimmie Fleming Award for services to bridge at the last Annual General Meeting of the English Bridge Union.

On the county scene, the Essex teams have had mixed success. The season started on a high note with both 'A' and 'B' teams winning the Metropolitan Cup, the first time that both teams have won this prestigious cup in the same year, and it has been some time since either team has won it. Once again the team in the Tollmache Cup was drawn in a very strong Section, and although doing well, did not do well enough to qualify for the final. The standard in this competition is very high, and only one of the eight seeded teams managed to qualify for this year's final. In the Eastern Counties League, the 'A' team had a wretched season, but the 'B' and 'C' teams kept the flag flying, the 'B' team coming 3rd and the 'C' team 2nd, the same positions as last year. Thanks are due to the captains - Wendy Coldham and Brian Robinson, and to Roger and Jill Tattersfield who have been responsible for the administration and the match refreshments. We are sorry that Brian is no longer able to carry on as captain, and we wish him well. Maureen Vede has agreed to captain the 'C' team, and we hope that all the players will give her their full support.

Over the past year no changes were made to the competition programme, and most competitions went very smoothly. I will comment more fully later. Last summer we held a Green Pointed Swiss Teams, and once again it was very successful. We are holding a Joint Venture this coming summer with Hertfordshire, and members are asked to support this weekend as much as possible. Again, I should like to point out that the money raised at such events enable the Committee to keep other costs down - both county subscriptions and competition entry fees.

Every year, several clubs take part in the Eastern Counties Simultaneous Pairs, and last November we were able to raise £787.03p, which was donated to the Essex Air Ambulance Service. We received a Silver Certificate from them, and this was displayed on the Essex web-site.

Several references have already been made in my report to the Essex web-site, and this addition is a most noteworthy achievement and benefits the whole of the Association. Last year I reported that it was on the way, and since last summer it has been up-and-running. As well as competition results, details have been given of players' successes in national events, and we are posting the results and tables for the Eastern Counties League. Four clubs have their own web-sites and we are linked to these, as well as other relevant sites. There is now a new page - a notice board, and it has recently been used for the first time. Our webmaster is Jill Tattersfield, and many thanks are due to her for her hard work and skills, often up-dating results very late in the evening.

Bridge for All, the teaching scheme introduced by the E.B.U. has been in operation since 1999. All students become E.B.U./Essex members through the classes, but unfortunately in Essex some councils will not permit the additional payment. It was hoped though that many of the Bridge for All students would keep their membership alive when they ceased the classes, but this has definitely not happened in Essex. Everyone has been mailed about the Novice events open to them, including an additional one in December. In addition Alaric Cundy has made every effort to contact teachers more than once for every event, but

numbers entering have been a little disappointing. Mr. Cundy now has a very detailed knowledge of the bridge teachers in the county and where they are teaching. Thanks are due to him for the hard work he has put in to set up the data base and run the competitions, also to those who help him on these occasions.

Your Committee has met throughout the year, mainly to create a good competition programme, at good venues, and create an environment that will attract members. Last summer a meeting of club representatives was held, and various subjects were discussed with Committee members, particularly the question of compulsory membership. This had been introduced by Suffolk first at a County Secretary's meeting, and secondly at Council. Later all Essex clubs were mailed and an excellent response received. Eventually, the proposal did not reach Council for debate, as it was obvious that nearly everyone was against such a move. Suffolk have put forward one or two different ideas, one a tiered subscription, but this was tried some years ago, and it failed. Essex was represented on the E.B.U. Council by Sid Prince, Paul Spencer and myself, and Paul and I have served on the Tournament Committee and Paul on the Laws and Ethics in addition. Apart from the membership question, other matters of importance were the Commonwealth Nations Bridge Championships which was agreed could be held and run by Manchester after much discussion, and the Junior European Championships to be held in Torquay. Both will take place in July, and due to the heavy workload at Headquarters during that period, there will not be a July Council Meeting.

The one activity that creates interest right through the season is the League, and Roger Tattersfield will give you full details in his report. Thanks are due to both Roger and Jill for the hard work involved in getting the Leagues under way and sending out results to all teams. Again, the web-site has created a lot more interest and excitement towards the end of the season as the results have been posted.

Two Government measures affect bridge players across the country. Firstly, the new Data Protection Act has meant that the data held by the counties has had to be registered with the E.B.U. Essex only holds details of membership - addresses, telephone numbers, clubs - that have been supplied by the members themselves. Several officials hold data - not all the same - in order to carry out their duties. Should any member wish to see that data, it must be made available to them, but I can assure you that we do not hold any secret files!

The second piece of legislation does not directly affect the majority of clubs in Essex. It is to do with access for disabled players, and will be in place in about two years time. The county uses village halls for competitions, and these are single-storyed, and already have good access. However, where a club or county hires a room elsewhere, that venue will have to have access and facilities for disabled players. The E.B.U. is looking into this Act and will inform all counties and clubs of what it all means.

How can we attract new members to our main clubs and to our competitions? How can we move forward? It is not just the Committee and some anonymous group of players who are the Essex Contract Bridge Association - all of you affiliated to the county are. Make visitors and newcomers welcome at your club, encourage them to enter the League and try out a competition. You are the Essex Contract Bridge Association - all of you can help.

COMPETITION REPORT

While numbers of competitors entering Essex competitions remain fairly constant, your Committee is concerned that numbers are not increasing. Everyone tries to analyse the reason why, but I doubt if there is an easy answer. County competitions are squeezed by the E.B.U. on one side with an ever increasing programme, and on the other by the clubs who provide such excellent facilities for players. Travelling too is an issue, and players do not seem quite so competitive these days. This year some competitions showed an increase and others a slight loss, and this seems to depend on the actual day scheduled. Clashes occur with other events, and with such a crowded calendar, this is unavoidable. Competitions are moved around to a slight extent, while trying to keep a balance between pairs and team events.

Our club competitions are always well supported and very keenly contested.

Players are to be thanked for taking along tables and for helping set up and put away where necessary, and clubs for the use of their tables when using their club venue. Also, of course, thanks are due to all those who have directed over the season.

Finally, on behalf of the players and the Committee, I should like to thank Audrey Hartley for her work as Tournament Secretary over the past three years. Not only has she directed competitions, but organised and duplicated boards for several of the events.

SOUTH EAST AND WEST ESSEX LEAGUE REPORT 2001/2002

Another season has now finished and once again we would like to thank you all for making it so enjoyable.

Over 300 members played in the League this year with 42 teams in the South East and 25 in the West. Relative to last year is a disappointing reduction of 6 with the shortfall being all in the West and the Novices. There were 3 withdrawals during the year and 5 matches were not played. These are low figures compared to recent years but they are disappointing since each unplayed match is likely to have an impact on promotion or relegation and to affect teams other than those directly involved.

The Novices Division continued to be very successful although numbers were down because last year's successful teams progressed to the main league.

The inaugural mini-league for the top 2 teams in each of the first divisions was won by Loughton Collier who finished just ahead of Seeds Llama.

During the season we asked teams in the first divisions if they would prefer to continue with the mini-league play-off or change to a knockout competition for the Premier League trophy. The choice was clearly in favour of the knockout and 8 teams will be invited to participate during the summer.

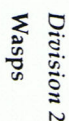
