The Committee will be looking at the possible purchase of the duplimating machine.

4. Hon. Secretary's Report.

This is attached in full. It's adoption was proposed by Mr. Sid Prince, and seconded by Lady Telford and approved unanimously. Mr Green thanked Mrs. Curtis for the considerable amount of work done over the year.

5. Hon. Tournament Secretary's Report

Mr Bob Allen started by thanking all those who had helped during the year - Mr Pat O'Gara, Mr. Sid Prince, Mrs. Margaret Curtis, Mrs. Jill Tattersfield (scoring and printing results), Mr. Eric Field, and clubs which had lent out their tables, in particular Mr. Bernie Hunt.

Mrs. Jill Day said how much she appreciated the introduction of duplimated boards.

The adoption of the report was prposed by Mr. Ray Cornell, seconded by Mrs. Jill Tattersfield, and approved unanimously.

Mr. Green thanked Mr. Allen for the efficient manner in which he organised and ran competitions.

6. Hon. Treasurers Report

Mr. Philpott was unavoidably absent, but had sent a short report, and copies of the Accounts which had been circulated to the meeting. He drew attention to the large amount in the Postal Account, due to the early receipt of membership fees, the small profit this year from the One-Day Joint Venture, the lower cost of the summer printing (due to a change of printers) and the slight difference in competition profits (due to small alterations in the programme).

The adoption of the accounts and report was proposed by Mrs. Tessa Beer, and seconded by Mrs. Wendy Coldham and agreed by the meeting.

In Mr. Philpott's absence Mr. Green proposed the re-election of Mr. Cordingley as the Hon. Auditor, and this was agreed by the meeting.

Mr. Green thanked Mr. Philpott for his excellent house-keeping.

7. Hon. League Secretary's Report

This is attached in full.

There were no questions or comments, and Mrs. Pat O'Gara proposed the adoption of the report, seconded by Mr. Richard Perryman, and agreed by the meeting.

Mr. Green the thanked both Dr. Tattersfield and Mrs. Jill Tattersfield for all the hard work done to make the league so successful.

8. Subscriptions 2005/2006

Mr. Tony Philpott had proposed that they should stay the same for a further year, £4.50 for the Essex individual portion, and £5.00 for clubs. This had been endorsed by the committee, and was agreed by those present.

9. Election of Officers and Committee for 2004/2005

There had been no resignations and no proposals for the offices, so all members were declared elected for the coming year.

Mr. Green thanked all those on the committee who had not given reports, but gave of their time to the Association. He welcomed Mr. Po Shing Lee to the Committee as the new Youth/Schools Officer.

10. Any Other Business

- a. Other Activities/Social Bridge Mr. Po Shing Lee asked if the Committee had considered events such as those at Ham House a visit to a stately home in the morning + bridge + tea in the afternoon. Mrs. Curtis said that the Committee had discussed it, but were not in favour of such activities being combined. At present there is no sign that this increases membership.
- b. County Membership A question was asked as to wether one can pay county membership only. The answer is "no".
- c. Club events, i.e. Swiss Teams This was raised as to the participation in such events. Mrs. Curtis explained that open events run by clubs have to have a licence, and all members taking part have to be E.B.U. members. However, a club can run an event for it's own members, without E.B.U. membership.
- d. Events for non-members Each county can run a limited number of events for non-members. Mrs. Curtis said that Essex already run the limit of such competitions, plus a starter division in the League. Again, there is little proof that vast new members join via this route.Mrs.Curtis

stated that county membership seemed to grow faster when anyone entering a county competition automatically joined.

Mrs. Jill Day thanked the committee on behalf of the membership for all thier hard work.

There being no further business the meeting closed.

Mrs. Teddy Schram presented the prizes and trophies and she and Mrs. Margaret Green and Mrs. Maureen White were presented with flowers. Thanks were extended to Mrs. Green and Mr. and Mrs. White for preparing the Wine and Cheese Party which followed. The meeting finally closed with a social pairs event.

HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT - 2004/2005

The 2003/2004 season seems to have vanished twice as fast as all those gone before. Essex is a thriving county with many people freely working for others to enjoy their favourite pastime. But, our actual membership has dropped slightly, and we now have 1110 individual members, of which 73 are Bridge for All students, and 57 affiliated clubs. However, as in most other counties, senior players are not renewing their membership and new players are not joining. Many novice competitions are put before them, but it is not easy to entice them out of their cosy clubs. Much hard work, especially by Alaric Cundy has gone into mailing new players, teachers and clubs, and it is disappointing when numbers entering are few. There are still a large number of classes being held round Essex. Many of these are privately run, and Alaric Cundy would much like to know of these, so all these mailings can be sent to them, either by post or email. It is vitally important that these newcomers start taking part in county events, or without new players our Association will die. Thanks are due to Alaric and Eric Field who have put a lot of hard work into these events.

Country results have fluctuated up and down throughout the bridge season. We started on a high note in the Metropolitan Cup the A team once again winning, though the B and C teams did not shine. The Essex team failed to qualify for the Tollemache Cup Final, the draw is never very kind to us, and Essex was in a particularly strong section. As far as the Eastern Counties League is concerned, the C team was the most successful, just losing the vital last match and coming 3°. Comment is often made about the size of the Pools. It is true that some players might get extra matches, but it is also true that for some matches we would not even be able to field teams. Players must realise that they must accept at least one away match per season, and not leave the travelling to a small group of dedicated players. Thanks are due to Wendy Coldham for masterminding the mailings and captaining the 2° team, to Maureen Vede, captain of the 3° team, and to Jill Tattersfield who organises and does the refreshments for our home matches.

On the individual side, once again Essex players have featured prominently in national events and congresses. These are always recognised in our County newsletter and on the website, but mention must be made of Alan Green and David Clark 3rd in the National Pairs Final, Ian Green representing England at Under 21 level, and Chelmsford team of Audrey Hartley, Alison Spencer, Richard Easton and Peter Jones reaching the quarter finals of the NICKO, the national inter-club championships.

Bob Allen will report on the competitions held throughout the year, and the changes and additions that we put into place. Results have been on the web-site in record time, and as usual all competitors have been sent complete results, and master points within a week. One small change, which some players may have noticed master-points for ordinary pairs events are now computer driven, saving considerable time for Bob. Essex held a joint One-Day Joint EBU/county swiss teams last June, and unfortunately attracted just over 60 teams. The venue was excellent, but costly, and we only made a small profit. It has been decided that in future we will just concentrate on the joint Herts/Essex weekend, thus ensuring a good profit for both counties.

Referring to the county web site, Jill Tattersfield has worked extremely hard over the year to up-date our software. It was not designed for well over 100 pages, and it also meant the she was entering results well after midnight. After a few hiccups, the new system is up and running and Jill can now get to bed a little earlier. All those who are computer literate should browse through the Essex web-site. All results are up-to-date, national successes are highlighted, all Eastern Counties League results are given and tables supplied. There is an entry form for all those who have lost theirs, and forward dates of competitions are given as far in advance as possible. As one who still relies on pigeon post, thanks are due to Jill for such excellence.

Roger Tattersfield will report on the Essex League in detail. At the introduction of the League way back in our history, players flocked to play. It is unfortunate that numbers have fallen considerably, mainly due, we feel, to the difficulty in travelling, more club bridge, and the problems of fixing matches. We hope that more members will make up teams to play in the two areas available to them.

The four Committee meetings held during the year have been well attended. In addition to the usual matters the Committee has discussed the EBU Development Plan, new printers, the Disability Act, new venues and Youth care.

On the schools and Junior side, we are delighted with the on-going successes of Ian Green and Laura Perryman. Unfortunately, our Liaison Officer, Alan Shillitoe, has been unable to devote time to this somewhat thankless task, and he has decided to give his allegiance to Bedford in future.

We are fortunate to have a member willing to take his place, Po Shing Lee, who has many new ideas, such as using the internet, to attract schools and young people to the game. He hopes to introduce mini-bridge into primary schools, and
