Minutes of the 60th Annual General Meeting of the E.C.B.A. held on Saturday, 12th May 2007 at Brentwood County High School, Brentwood, Essex.

Present: Mr. R. Green (Hon-Chairman), Mrs M. Curtis (Hon. Secretary), Mr. A. Philpott (Hon. Treasurer), Dr. R. Tattersfield (Hon. League Secretary).

Members of the Committee and 36 Members of the Association.

Apologies for absence were received from: Mrs T. Schram (Hon. Vice-President) I. Moss, A. Cundy, P. O'Gara, Lady Telford, D. Valtisiaris, R. Clarke, B. Cowley, P. S. Lee.

1. Hon. Chairman's Opening Remarks

Association had not got where it is today without the services of many people. He drew attention to the splendid record of Mr 'Mac' Grant, who had done so much. He was one of the first members, entering and winning many competitions, eventually becoming county captain. From 1972 to 1984 he was the Hon. Chairman, and had become Hon. President from 1989 to early this year, when he had tendered his resignation, due to ill-health. Unfortunately, Mr Green also had to report the resignation of a Committee member, Mr Eric Field, who had enthusiastically helped the Association with his wide knowledge of club bridge. His wise counsel will be missed. Lastly, Mr Green recalled the sad passing of Mr Bob Allen, our county Tournament Secretary, a quiet, modest man who had expertly overseen and directed our competitions for the past four years.

2. Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting.

These had been circulated and were taken as read. They were agreed to be a correct record, and their adoption was proposed by Mrs W. Coldham, seconded by Mrs I. Sheril, and passed unanimously by the meeting.

3. Matters Arising

- a. Constitution The Chairman stated that it had been decided not to reprint the Constitution with the amendments at present, as the E.B.U. had highlighted the possible changes to the sections regarding behaviour, appeals, etc. because of the Human Rights Act. The Committee had been unable to prepare these in time for this AGM, as Sussex had not yet produced a proposed copy.
- b. Play-by-dates for Knock-out Competitions These had gone much better during the season.

4. Report by the Hon. Secretary.

Dr Tattersfield commented on the selection policy as outlined, and in the original letter to players, and said that he, personally, agreed with it.

5. Report of the Competitions.

This is attached in full. It's adoption was proposed by Mr E. Field, seconded by Mrs J. Hair and passed unanimously by the meeting.

6. Report by Hon. Treasurer

Mr. Philpott presented the accounts (attached in full), and commented on the various sections, drawing attention to additional funds under competitions, due to extra income from the Stevenage One Day Venture, which had been held for a payment which did not materialise.

He was asked what came under the heading of capitation, and he said that this was money due to the EBU for National Pairs, Corwen, Pachabo and Garden Cities competitions.

Mr K. Thompson enquired about the fairly large sum of money in the bank, and why it was there. Mr Philpott replied that it was there for a "rainy day", and for any special expenditure. Mr Thompson said that with the falling membership bridge needed to be marketed. In reply he was told that indeed events are marketed through post, e-mail and the web-site, but to no-avail. However, the Committee was being joined by someone in marketing and hopefully new ideas would be forthcoming. It was stated by members present that people have less time now for activities, all sports clubs are short of players, and in particular helpers, and bridge players on the whole prefer social bridge, labelling bridge clubs as too fierce.

The Accounts were proposed for adoption by Mrs S. Burtt, seconded by Mr E. Field and agreed unanimously by the meeting.

Mr Green proposed from the chair that the auditor, Mr J. Cordingly, whom he thanked warmly, should be re-appointed and this was agreed unanimously. Mr Green then thanked Mr Philpott for his hard work and said that the Association was lucky to have such an excellent custodian of the money.

7. Report by the Hon. League Secretary

This report is attached in full.

The adoption of the report was proposed by Dr M. Smith, seconded by Mrs V. Mollison and adopted by the meeting.

Mr. Green the thanked Dr Tattersfield and Mrs Tattersfield for all their hard work for the League and their related competitions. It is much appreciated.

8. Subscriptions 2008/2009

Mr A. Philpott, the Hon. Treasurer, said that in view of the excellent results this year, he proposed that the Essex portion of the subscription for 2008/9 should remain the same for both the individual and club. This was agreed by the meeting.

9. Election of Officers and Committee

He hoped that someone would offer to undertake this task. The remaining Officers and members were willing to continue and they were duly elected.

Mr Green said that he would like to thank everyone on the committee who had not given a report - Messrs E. Field, D. Valtisiaris, S. Prince, A. Cundy, P.S. Lee and Mrs Hair.

10. Any Other Business

There was no further business.

Mr Green then closed the meeting. Mrs Margaret Green presented the prizes and trophies and she herself presented with flowers. The meeting closed with a Wine and Cheese Party and bridge.

HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT - 2006/2007

What has the last year brought to the County Association? Alas, not a growth in membership - those days seem to be long gone - although there are many bridge players in the clubs, and even more taking part in social bridge and charity drives. As with so many other sports, have people generally lost the competitive spirit? However, some clubs are losing members and they are not being replaced by newcomers and in particular younger members. The E.B.U. is very conscious of this trend, and is thinking of ideas to redress this quite alarming state.

Individual membership stands at about 950 + Bfa members, and affiliated clubs membership is still high - 57. As far as individual results are concerned, Essex players continue to do well in National and regional competitions. High positions are obtained in One Day Swiss events and congresses, and teams progress through several rounds of knock-out competitions. Major successes

The December Intermediate Pairs event had the most entries. Alaric Cundy has devoted a great deal of time and effort to get these events going, and is disappointed to have such a poor response. Eventually, the April events had to be cancelled.

Po Shing Lee has also had limited success with the schools and youth programme. He has identified schools ready to accept mini-bridge, but healpers are needed. Anyone who would like to be involved should, please give me your name. Most of the schools are in the Chelmsford/Brentwood area.

One new project was the survey of club bridge in Essex, initiated by Po Shing Lee. All the clubs in Essex were mailed with the survey, some of the larger clubs having more copies. The results showed the Committee that generally speaking the competitions are well regarded, but a large number of players were quite content with their local club bridge only. It also highlighted the aging of the bridge players in clubs - younger members (not necessarily those in their twenties, but in their 30's and 40's) are desperately needed if we are to continue in the years to come. A short summary is available on the Essex web-site.

This web-site is now part and parcel of Essex bridge, and thanks to Jill Tattersfield it is kept up-to-date with all the results and achievements. Last year some hands from the Tollemache Club Heat were displayed, with comment, on the web-site. It has been suggested that perhaps this should be done on a regular basis, highlighting interesting hands from either a competition or the League. The web-site attracts about 1000 hits a month.

TOURNAMENT REPORT 2006/2007

Over the past years, entries to some competitions have dropped, mostly those involving travel and having to fix matches. However, entries to others have maintained a fairly good entry, especially the Swiss Pairs and the day-time Senior Competitions. An extra one is planned for the coming June at Thorpe Bay, and this will cover three different areas of the county. The Tony Kelvin Trophy for Swiss Teams was once again started early with a special lunch and afternoon cake to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the association. However, it does not seem to attract any more teams, so we are going back to the afternoon start next season.

Our One-Day Green Pointed weekend with Hertfordshire was fairly successful, but unfortunately clashed with the Final Weekend of the Football World Cup. The profits contribute considerably to our funds and enable entry fees for our competition to be kept low, and support our novice events. In the future the counties will be responsible for all aspects of the weekend, and will be paying a licence fee per table, per session. This coming July it has been decided not to increase the entry fee, and it is hoped that this will not affect the profitability of the event.

As many of you are aware, newcomers are increasingly put off entering county and national competitions by the more competitive behavour of players, and in some cases by their apparent rudeness, unintentional no doubt, but thoughtless. This has been highlighted by the EBU in English Bridge and by the new chairman, and Essex is endevouring to do the same. Competitors are being reminded of the Code of Conduct expected of them at all competitions, and newcomers are being made welcome and helped at all times.

Finally, I would like to thank all those who have helped with the competitions after the untimely death of Bob Allen, especially Bill West, Roger and Jill Tattersfield, Pat O'Gara and Val Mollison. The county could not have managed without them.

SOUTH EAST AND WEST ESSEX LEAGUE REPORT 2006/2007

In many ways the Leagues have had a disappointing season with a further reduction in the number of competing teams. The West Essex League was reduced to two Divisions and the South-East to four. Despite this there has been a lot of activity and, in general, teams seem to enjoy the format offered by the league structure which usually gives a relaxed and friendly environment.

Nearly 250 members played in the League this year with 29 teams in the South East and 14 in the West. Relative to last year this is a reduction of 12 and has accelerated the decline of recent seasons. There was no Novices Division this year as there were insufficient teams, Those who applied were integrated into the main leagues with varying success rates.

There were 2 withdrawals during the year and 3 matches were not played. Unfortunately these matches had a direct impact on some of the main championship and promotion issues and affect teams other than those directly involved. It is very difficult for the League organisers to ascertain responsibility for unplayed games and the general rule will continue to be that neither team shall get any points unless there is a very good case and the organisers have been kept informed as problems develop. As always a number of teams were late in finishing their programme and this puts unnecessary pressure on their opponents and on the organisers.

All the League champions are now known and. as always, it is good to see some new names amongst the winners. Full details will be given at the prize presentation. The Premier League play-off was won by Seeds Llama (Paul Spencer) who beat Crowstone (Alan Cohen) in the final. We will continue this knock-out format for the forthcoming season.

The League Cup has again proved to be a very successful event with 21 teams taking part. It is a very tight schedule and unfortunately we cannot announce the winners yet. In the final Waltham Foresters (Tony Verran) will play the winners of the match between Loughton Collier (Phil Collier) and Chelmsford Black (Brian Berkley). In last year's final Seeds Llama (Paul Spencer) beat Chelmsford Blue (Peter Jones). The Committee decided not to introduce seeding for this event and this decision enabled teams from the lower divisions to beat the current champions in the South-East and the previous year's winners in the West. Congratulations to the two teams concerned.
