ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING REPORTS & ACCOUNTS and COUNTY NEWSLETTER

Autumn 2009

Minutes of the 62nd Annual General Meeting of the ECBA, held on Sunday 10th May 2009 at Little Baddow Memorial Hall.

Present: Mrs M Curtis (Hon Secretary), A Philpott (Hon Treasurer), Dr R Tattersfield (Hon League Secretary), Members of the Committee and 25 members of the Association

Apologies for absence: R Green (Hon Chairman), E Cockle (Hon Tournament Secretary), Lady Telford, Mrs J Hair, Mrs W Coldham, I Moss, A Kitchin, Mrs L Wells, M Wood, Mrs C Love, N Bardsley, Dr M and Mrs S Smith, PO'Gara.

Mrs Curtis opened the meeting by informing the meeting that Mr Richard Green (Hon Chairman), was not well enough to attend the meeting, and sent sincere apologies for his absence. She proposed that Mr Philpott should be acting Chairman, and this was agreed by the meeting.

. Hon Chairman's Opening Remarks

Mr Philpott stated that the Association had lost two prominent members during the year - Mr 'Mac' Grant, our past President, and Mr Sid Prince, one time Tournament Secretary. He outlined their outstanding records for the county and the service both had given. He added that soon after Mr Grant's death, his son John an ex-Essex player, informed us that Mac's wife Barbara had also died.

2. Minutes of the last Meeting

These had been circulated and were taken as read. They were agreed to be a correct record and their approval was proposed by Mrs J Tattersfield, seconded by Mrs C Lovett and signed by the Chairman.

3. Matters arising

There were no matters arising

4. Hon Secretary's Report

This is attached in full.

Mr B West enquired about the number of Essex clubs and the numbers lost through P2P. Mrs Curtis stated that about 3 years ago there were 60 clubs, but at the end of April 2009 there were 52, and a further 2 had already not reaffiliated. She reported that with conversations she had had with club officials there were likely to be further losses from 2010.

Mrs Taylor stated that at one competition not enough boards had been available as players had just turned up without notification. She suggested a fine for this, and possibly an additional charge for late entries. Mrs Cook said that usually extra boards were always ordered and this was unfortunate. Extra charges did not find favour with the meeting, as we want as many entrants as possible. One help in future will be a new email address, especially for competition entries.

The adoption of the report was proposed by Mr B West, seconded by Mrs V Mollison and passed by the meeting.

Mr Philpott thanked Mrs Curtis for her continued work for the Association.

5. Report by the Hon Tournament Secretary

In Mr Cockle's absence Mr Philpott read his report and thanked him for his first year's hard work. Adoption of the report was proposed by Mr F Morrison, seconded by Mrs C Lovett and passed by the meeting.

6. Hon Treasurer's Report

Mr Philpott presented the accounts for 2008/9 and went through the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account, highlighting certain items. There was a loss of £431. He explained that due to a misprint last year in the subscription, the additional £1 collected for each member had been placed in the 2009/10 account, to which it would rightly belong.

There were no questions and the adoption of the accounts was proposed by Mr C Taylor, seconded by Mr A Cundy and passed by the meeting.

7. Hon League Secretary's Report

Dr Tattersfield's report is attached in full. He added these comments:

- l team playing all matches at the end of the season
- Teams in lower divisions using unauthorised or overly aggressive systems
- VP scale is very slightly different to the one now used by the EBU, and will be amended

Dr Tattersfield said that all these will be addressed. He thanked Mrs J Tattersfield for running the South-East Section of the League.

Mrs S Taylor asked if anything further could be done about Dr Tattersfield's comment a). A possible fine? Tighter deadlines? Dr Tattersfield stated that he would be more pro-active if told that there was a problem. Mrs Taylor said that the same problem had arisen this year with the League Cup, and after discussion it was agreed that there should be a firm deadline for each round, with a team having to ask for an extension.

Dr Tattersfield's report was adopted by the meeting, and Mr Philpott thanked

both him and Mrs Tattersfield for their excellent running of the Leagues

8. Constitution

Mr Philpott stated that the Schedule of Disciplinary Procedures to be added to the Constitution had been proposed by the EBU, and our Hon Solicitor thought that it should be brought in this year. In 2010 a new Constitution will be presented for approval, which will include the new P2P membership. As Chairman, Mr Philpott proposed its adoption and this was agreed by the meeting.

9. Subscriptions 2010/11

Mr Philpott stated that the Committee had had to set the county's portion of P2P early in April, and had set it at 9p. This should cover the amount raised by subscriptions currently, and is based on the figures supplied by the clubs themselves. The EBU has stated that if the P2P scheme looks unlikely to succeed they will scrap it at the end of July. Consequently the county needs to safeguard to have a subscription in place. It is proposed, therefore, that the county portion would be £6. The club subscription will be collected separately, and it was proposed that this should be £6. also.

A question was raised about the P2P possibly not taking place, and Mrs Curtis gave details of the ante-scheme comments/papers, etc. that have been circulated. Mr Williams added that not only would clubs not re-affiliate, but some players were already moving away from affiliated clubs.

The adoption of the two subscriptions for 2010/11 were proposed by Mrs V Mollison and seconded by Mrs J Tattersfield and agreed by the meeting.

10. Election of Officers and Committee for the year 2009/10

Mr Philpott drew attention to Mr Valtisiaris' resignation, received after printing the Agenda. Ms N Cook has offered to be the Youth/School Officer, and the Committee proposed that her offer should be accepted. This leaves two vacancies for Officers of Committee. All other Committee members are willing to stand again, and there were no proposals for change.

Mr Philpott thanked all those who had served during 2008/9, and who had not presented a report - Ms N Cook, Mrs J Tattersfield, Mr A Cundy, Mr I Moss, Mr D Valtisiaris and Mrs J Hair.

Mr Philpott also thanked Mr Cordingly, the Hon Auditor and said that he was willing to stand again. This was agreed by the meeting.

11. Any Other Business

- a) Mrs S Taylor queried a partnership in the future Eastern Counties League. Mrs Curtis stated that all players are asked to list their partners in order, and when they consider they would be happy to play a 32-board match of such standing. The Selectors trust their players, and do not check their statements.
