COUNTY TEAMS

Suffolk has three teams in the Eastern Counties League (ECL). Players in the ECL and the Tollemache Cup are selected by the County Captain.

TEAM SELECTION: The County Captain welcomes players who would like to play for Suffolk in the ECL matches.

All volunteers will usually play at least one match during the season. Green Points are awarded in County matches - $\frac{3}{4}$ for an A team win, $\frac{1}{2}$ for a B team win and $\frac{1}{4}$ for a C team win.

SCBA Competitions

1. Pairs Events

SENIORS PAIRS A single-session pairs event for the Stokes Cup, open to pairs who are both 60+ by Dec 31 of the competition year. An embedded Veterans Prize event is open to pairs who are both 70+ and are not the overall winners.

LADIES & MENS PAIRS Two single-session events, played in parallel, for the Ladies Bowl and the John Gudge Trophy, respectively.

SUFFOLK PAIRS CHAMPIONSHIP Played as heats in Clubs, a single-session Semi-Final and a two-session Final for the Alexander Cup. The top three finishers qualify to represent Suffolk in the Corwen Trophy.

NOVICE PAIRS A single-session event for novices. For qualification criteria, contact Richard Evans.

MID-ANGLIA PAIRS A multi-session event for the Mid Anglia Rose Bowl.

MIXED PAIRS A single-session event for the Ringer Cup with an embedded competition for **MARRIED PAIRS** who are not the overall winners competing for the Lang Cup.

JYL MARSH INDIVIDUAL A single-session simple-systems event for the Waters Cup, each player partnering as many of the other players as possible.

AGM PAIRS A single-session event following the AGM.

CLUB PLAYERS CHAMPIONSHIP A single-session stratified event for players below the rank of Premier Master.

2. Leagues

WINTER LEAGUE A Teams-of-4 inter-club competition played in members' homes.

SUMMER LEAGUE A Teams-of-8 inter-club competition typically played in clubs on regular club evenings.

EASTERN COUNTIES LEAGUE Three teams of 8 are selected by the County Captain to represent Suffolk.

SCBA Competitions

3. Teams Events

SUFFOLK TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIP for the Jim Pettit Cup. Two rounds are held on one day. Round 1 qualifies approximately half the field to play in Round 2. Those not qualifying contest the Suffolk Plate. The top four teams from Round 2 enter a knock-out stage of head-to-head matches. The winners qualify to represent Suffolk in the Pachabo Cup.

CLUB TEAMS OF 8 CHAMPIONSHIP for the Abbeygate Shield. A two-session event, the winners qualifying to represent Suffolk in the Regional Final of the Garden Cities Trophy.

CLUB TEAMS OF 4 CHAMPIONSHIP for the Thornway Cup. A two-session event in which Clubs are invited to enter as many teams as they wish.

PIVOT TEAMS COMPETITION for the Ida Frost Bowl. A Teams-of-4 knock-out competition, typically played in members' homes, with matches of three stanzas in which each team member partners the other three members of their team.

General Competition Rules

1. Competitions Secretary

- 1.1 The Competitions Secretary's decision is final in interpreting or varying these rules where they do not explicitly specify a course of action.
- 1.2 The Competitions Secretary may vary the calendar and, in exceptional circumstances, cancel events. If entries have already been taken they shall be refunded in full.
- 1.3 The Competitions Secretary is responsible for liaising with clubs involved with the running of SCBA events. Terms of reference for both parties are separately documented.
- 1.4 The Competitions Secretary is responsible for ensuring, though not necessarily effecting, the submission of onward data to the EBU.
- 1.5 The Competitions Secretary is final arbiter of disputes other than those which are the purview of directors and appeal committees. A designated committee member overseeing a competition arbitrates but the Competitions Secretary may overrule.
- 1.6 Any member may apply to the Competitions Secretary for clarification and amplification of any rule applicable in the Suffolk Association.

2. Eligibility

- 2.1 Individuals: all SCBA events are open to Full Members of the association. Additionally, all but a few events – those with the potential for Suffolk representation in national competition - are open to Adopted Members and bona fide members of overseas National Bridge Organisations.
- 2.2 Clubs: SCBA events for clubs are open only to those affiliated to Suffolk. Clubs are free to select representatives subject only that they be club and English Bridge Union members. That includes non-SCBA members even though the club might qualify to represent Suffolk in a national event.
- 2.3. Novices and newcomers: the association may run events for those new to competitive bridge. For these events only, participants need not be SCBA or EBU members.
- 2.4. Open events: where the SCBA runs an open event licensed by the EBU, for example the Felixstowe Congress, eligibility is per an EBU national-level event.

3. Entries

Entries to be made, unless otherwise stated, at least four days prior to the date of the competition, by post, email or telephone, late entries accepted at the discretion of the Competitions Secretary. An entry to a competition is a commitment to pay the competition fee. A refund will be made if an entry is withdrawn at least five days before the date of the competition.

4. Rules of Play

- 4.1. All events, including league matches, are subject to the normal rules of duplicate bridge maintained by the EBU.
- 4.2. Only systems and conventions licensed by the EBU may be used and, unless stated otherwise, up to EBU Level 4 conventions are allowed. Players are required to complete system cards.
- 4.3. In team matches played in stanzas cancelled boards (whether as a result of a director's ruling, mis-boarding, etc.) shall be added to the next stanza. Those anomalies that come to light after the start of the final stanza are not replaced.
- 4.4. In the event of a team arriving more than 30 minutes late for the start of play a reduction of the match and award of IMPs to the non-offending side is appropriate. In the event of 90/45 minutes late arrival with/without notification the match shall be forfeit. The Competitions Secretary should be informed during the waiting period.

5. Directing and Disputes

- 5.1. The SCBA Chief Tournament Director is responsible for appointing directors for each event.
- 5.2. At events the Tournament Director is responsible for rulings and the conduct of play.
- 5.3. To obtain a ruling of first instance during a match played at home:
 - 5.3.1. Captains may agree upon an outcome.
 - 5.3.2. Before 10pm the Chief TD will endeavour to give a ruling in the first instance over the telephone.

- 5.3.3. Should the Chief TD be unreachable, either the League Secretary (if appropriate) or Competitions Secretary will arrange for a director to call back.
- 5.3.4. If no-one is available, teams may consult the EBU panel directors.
- 5.3.5. In the event of a ruling being unobtainable, the captains are to complete the standard form recording full details of the deal, bidding, systems, conventions, alerts and play and a description of the dispute. Both captains to sign and submit to the Competitions Secretary.
- 5.4. Rulings from both events and matches played privately may be appealed, and a copy of the Appeals Procedure will be supplied on demand. Appeals are normally subject to a financial deposit retained only when the petition is deemed frivolous.

6. Results

- 6.1. A match result is final when the result card is completed and signed by both captains.
- 6.2. Other events are final on distribution of results, unless an objection is lodged within the shortest possible time.
- 6.3. Ties shall be broken only for qualification purposes. Where onward qualification forces tie-breaking, the EBU approved mechanism shall be employed.

7. Master Points Awards

- 7.1. Master points will be awarded at all SCBA events in accordance with the EBU MP Handbook.
- 7.2. For venue-events it is the responsibility of the director on the day to make the appropriate MP awards.
- 7.3. For other competitions, either the committee-member with responsibility for the event (or league etc.) or the Competitions Secretary is responsible for MP awards.
- 7.4. For team-of-four events, up to six players are permitted but Master Points will be awarded only if the player has completed at least one third of the total number of boards.

8. Suffolk Championship Teams

This event is open only to Full Members of Suffolk and the winners may represent the county in the Pachabo Cup.

There is a qualifying stage and a Plate competition, usually in December. Four qualifying teams enter a knock-out stage of head-to-head matches.

- 8.1. There are two rounds, each a session of multiple teams, held on a single day.
- 8.2. Round One qualifies approximately half the field into Round Two. Those not qualifying contest the Suffolk Plate.
- 8.3. There are no carry-overs of score from Round One into the Plate or into Round Two.
- 8.4. The top four teams from Round Two form the two semi-finals to be played by arrangement. The winning team may select any opponent from the teams finishing second, third or fourth and must exercise that choice within two days.
- 8.5. The higher-placed team in Round Two is at home for the semifinal. The team with the larger winning margin in the semi-final is at home in the final (in the event of equal margins, the higher ranked team from Round Two).
- 8.6. Each semi-final to be of 32 boards, the final of 40 boards, all matches played in quarters. The allocation of seating-rights shall be in accordance with EBU recommendation.
- 8.7. In the event of knock-out match being tied at normal duration extra boards shall be played (and repeated as necessary). The rule is one eighth of the match-length (therefore four in the semi-final, five in the final). There are no seating rights and the extra boards are played in a single stanza.
- 8.8. In the case of a winning team with more than four members, only those playing more than one third of the boards in each of the semi-final and final shall be credited as Suffolk Champion.

9. Suffolk Championship Pairs

This event is open only to Full Members of Suffolk and high-finishers may represent the county in the Corwen Trophy. Players qualify from clubs, each club holding a single heat over a limited period (usually in October). There is a semi-final (February) then a 12-table final (April).

Qualification from the club-stage is subject to the following:

- 9.1. An individual may make only one attempt to qualify. Earlier participation disqualifies both members of a partnership making a later attempt.
- 9.2. At the club-stage, pairs may qualify only at a club where they are both members.
- 9.3. All pairs scoring 50% or more qualify for the semi-final.
- 9.4. Where the session nominated includes a mixture of those trying to qualify and those not, players must be made aware that to make a qualification attempt, they must opt in before play starts.
- 9.5. A club which meets more than once a week may run a heat in each session but note 9.1 continues to apply.
- 9.6. There will be an Open Heat, usually in January, for those unable to play earlier. The restriction of note 9.2 will not apply in the Open Heat.
- 9.7. There are no reserves from club qualification.
- 9.8. Although a qualifying attempt from a club does not require Full Member status, players are encouraged to bear in mind that only Full Members may take a place in the semi-final.

10. Winter and Summer Leagues

The Winter League is an open team-of-four competition with matches typically held in a player's home. Teams of up to six may be drawn from eligible players.

The Summer League is an inter-club team-of-eight competition with matches typically played alongside a club evening. There is no limit to the number of players who may represent a club during the season but all players must be bona fide members of that club. Separate regulations cover both.

11. Suffolk Representation

- 11.1. The winners of the Championship Teams represent Suffolk at the Pachabo Cup.
- 11.2. The top three from the Championship Pairs qualify to represent Suffolk at the Corwen Trophy.
- 11.3. The club winning the Club Teams-of-Eight, the Abbeygate Shield, represent Suffolk in the Garden Cities Trophy.
- 11.4. Any pair, team or club thus qualified subsequently finding themselves unable to compete must notify the Competitions Secretary as soon as possible to afford sufficient time to arrange replacements.
- 11.5. The make-up of teams in the Eastern Counties League and all parts of the Tollemache Cup is the sole remit of the County Captain.

12. Playing Conditions

The SCBA playing conditions are in line with those of the EBU; of particular note:

- 12.1. No animals other than guide dogs may be brought into the playing area.
- 12.2. Competitors at SCBA events are expected to dress properly and appropriately.
- 12.3. In matches played privately, smoking is prohibited at the playing table throughout.
However, the match host may designate an area where smoking is permitted during scoring breaks. If such an arrangement is to be made, prior notice must be given to the visitors and both captains agree how it will be managed.
- 12.4. Players are requested to turn off mobile phones at events and during matches. If a mobile phone rings during play a pair or team may be penalised. The tournament director may prohibit other electronic devices.
- 12.5. The SCBA supports the EBU in their efforts to ensure Best Behaviour at Bridge. Anyone who thinks they have been affected by bad behaviour should call the director immediately.
