Chairman's Report for the Committee 6th December 2020

We have successfully run the Kent Congress and the Dyer-Smith on BBO, albeit with some issues regarding the difference between Danish and Swiss movements. Thanks to Stephen Brown for his hard work in promoting the event, and to him, Paul Gibbons and Sharon Bayne for directing the events. We had a total of 75 tables across the 3 events, which was an increase on last year. The Committee have decided that the Corbett Cup/Plate and Mitchell Salver will not be played in 2021.

We are continuing to run online competitions on Saturdays, one for all players and one for NGS 9 and below. They continue to attract a good number of entries. Thanks again to Paul and Stephen for setting up the Saturday competitions and to them, Sharon and Mike Hampton for acting as Directors for them. Also Chris Lohan for her sterling work in producing commentaries on the hands for the NGS 9, which have no doubt helped make them so popular.

We are working on running competitions, and possibly the Saturday events, on Realbridge. The reports of members who have played on this platform are very positive. Farnborough and Bromley North are running taster events on Realbridge this month. This platform provides a much better social experience due to the use of video and audio. My hope is that, not only will it provide a better experience for our regular players, but that it will tempt those of our members who are currently not playing on line to do so. So far we are committed to holding the Hunter Homines and Fleming Femina on Realbridge in January.
